Over 600 girls of the Guru Gobind Singh Khalsa College for Girls, Sector 26, screamed to a deafening pitch as the auditorium reverberated with their shouts as soon as the UT SSP gave a clarion call to the girls to raise their voice against eve-teasing during an interaction today.

"Scream at the top of your voices till you are heard and the eve-teaser is put behind the bars," said UT SSP Nainihal Singh, who showed a glass to the girls in a jam-packed auditorium and said, "Scream loudly so that this glass breaks."

"I give you three chances; scream loudly so that this glass breaks. You should realise that women have an advantage over men. Your



police to encourage girls to raise their voice against eve-teasing. During the past one week, 36 girls have complained to the police control room regarding eve-teasing. Eighteen cases have been registered and 24 persons arrested so far.

The SSP has so far visited four prominent colleges in the city and interacted with over 5,000 girls, exhorting them to call the police and make the maximum use of technology to nab eve-teasers.

Is this drive temporary?

One of the college girls at the

assault on a college girl in Sector 42 that the police has woken up and initiated the drive. Will the drive continue next year or will the police go back to slumber again?" asked the girl.

The SSP said the drive would continue and that was why the police was interacting with girls. "We could have trained police officers to curb the menace. The main reason why we are interacting with college girls is to motivate them to raise their voice against eve-teasers and to complain to the police control room," said the SSP.

68 youths challaned

In the ongoing drive to curb the eve-teasing menace, the police control room today challaned 68 youths who were caught roaming outside girls' colleges and on the 'geri route'. The youngsters, mostly on bikes, were challaned for

come forward and lodge a complaint. Make a video using your cellphone cameras or note down the vehicle number and call at 100," said Singh.

Urging the girls not to resort to any illegal means to fight such miscreants on roads, like use of cutters, scissors or any sharp-edged things, he asked them to call the police instead.

Some psychology tips too

The SSP urged the girls to use their intuition to steer clear of people indulging in sexual harassment, while telling them that they could also make anonymous complaints. He told them they must use their intelligence and intuition in dealing with such situations and report.

Responding to the query of a girl on social networking website related menace, Singh added, "Such offenders who trail and bother a girl through a website will have to face serious consequences. Once a boy is held for eve-teasing, he cannot acquire a visa or get a government or private job. In short, his career is ruined. So come forward and complain."

Karnal resident Kashish Ali was arrested on charge of passing obscene remarks at girl in Sector 34 market on October 2. The accused was arrested but later bailed out. In second case, occupants of a (PB-06B-0019) were booked at Sector 11 police station on charge of eve-teasing near Sector 15 on October 2.

Police have registered 18 cases of eve-teasing over the last 10 days and arrested 24 persons. Some 36 calls related to eve-teasing have been received by police in the recent past, including his interaction with students of Sri Guru Gobind Singh

All-women PCR

The Chandigarh Police will soon deploy a PCR vehicle, along with policewomen, outside schools and colleges. "We are launching a Women PCR project. If everything falls in place, policewomen will be patrolling all the areas in the city," said Upadhyaya.

Encouraging girls to come forward and fight eve-teasing, UT SSP Naunihal Singh said, "Girls do not file complaints against such miscreants. They should not fear anyone and approach

the police so that the culprits are brought to book."

Thumbs down to moral police

"We are not here for moral policing. We are here to han-

dle the miscreants. I can proudly say that my team is doing well," said Rajender Pal Upadhyaya while responding to a query on whether the UT police was indulging in moral policing as the security of Punjab University had banned parking of cars in isolated places.

Students throw a volley of questions

The IG faced a volley of questions from male stu-

dents as well. They said girls were approaching the police with complaints of eve-teasing which turned out to be false. The girls were adopting the practice to settle scores. Queries related to special treatment to VIPs were also put up.

"Nobody can implicate you in a case," said the IG.

He advised the boys to stay away from bad company.

When asked why special treatment was meted out to

VIPs, the police officer said "There is a need to understand social responsibility. I am aware of all such this and am also a part of the nation that we are facing. We understand our responsibilities, we improve ourselves and society," said the IG.

Boys were seen making good escape. Many left a two-hour session, say they had to answer nature's call.
