Anti-Ragging Policy

The Anti-Ragging Cell is an important part of the Educational Institution's mechanism. According to UGC guidelines under the Act of 1956, which has been modified as UGC regulations on curbing the menace of ragging in higher educational institutions, the establishment of an anti-ragging cell is highly recommended.

As per the order of the Supreme Court of India and subsequent Notification from the University Grants Commission (UGC) which has issued very strong and detailed regulations for curbing the menace of ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, any of the following acts come under the purview of ragging.

- a) Any conduct by any student or student whether by words (spoken or written) or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student
- b) Indulging in rowdy or disciplined activities by any student or students which cause or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student
- c) Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, torment or embarrassment to adversely affect the psyche of such fresher or any other student
- d) Any act by a senior student that prevents or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher.
- e) Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic task assigned to an individual or a group of students.
- f) Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it; sexual abuse, and causing bodily harm or any otherdanger to health or person.
- g) Any act or abusive spoken words, e-mails, public insults which would also includederiving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student.
- h) Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any otherstudent.

Mandatory Undertaking

As per the UGC guidelines all the students are required to submit undertaking by filling Anti Ragging affidavit at the time of enrollment, on the link provided in the admission form(Online).

Punishment to those found guilty

The college level punishment in cases of ragging as perUGC directives includes one or more of the following:

- 1. Suspensions from attending classes and academic privileges.
- 2. Debarring from appearing any test/ examination or other evaluation process. Withholding of results.
- 3. Withholding/withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits.
- 4. Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national orinternational meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
- 5. Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for specific periods.
- 6. Banned from the hostel.

Anti -Ragging Committee

In order to stop ragging and implement anti-ragging measures in accordance with the guidelines set forth by the Supreme Court of India and UGC, an anti-ragging committee was established in this college.
