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



#### EVALUATION OF FEEDBACK FROM STUDENTS


Feedback process is critical for any institution as it gives a chance for improvement. Students are our greatest strength and so, their feedback regarding the facilities and infrastructure available to them, holds immense importance to the institution. For this purpose, a survey is conducted every year with the help of Google forms which helps in identifying the gaps. The institution then undertakes corrective measures to help bridge these gaps. During the session 2022-23, a total of 235students responded to the survey and following is its interpretation and conclusion.

#### 1. The teacher comes well prepared to the class.



It is pertinent that every teacher must prepare themselves well before entering the class. More than 84% students opined that their teacher came to class well prepared for the lecture. Moreover, the College library is well equipped with offline as well as online teaching material for use by the faculty as well as students.

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
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


#### 3. The teacher discusses course and program outcomes in class.





#### 5. Doubt clearing sessions are taken up by the teacher



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
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

#### 6. The teacher completes the entire syllabus





#### 8. The evaluation process is fair and unbiased



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
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

#### 9. Overall quality of teaching and learning is good.





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
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

#### 12. Photocopy facility is available in the campus.





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
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
use of the online repository to access study material, apart from getting books issued for their use. 74.5% students stated that the library was well stocked while 18.7% remained neutral.

#### 15. Online educational resources are available in the library.





#### 17. Grievances/ problems are redressed well in time.



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
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We have a fair and transparent method of dealing with complaints of various kinds. 60% students reported their agreement, while 25.5% chose to remain neutral.



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

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



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

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




#### **EVALUATION OF FEEDBACK FROM ALUMNI**





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

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
#### 4. FEEDBACK ANALYSIS REPORT: ALUMNI

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
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
## **COLLEGE ENVIRONMENT**

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
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




## **FACULTY**

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
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


# **Teaching and Learning Process**

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




from the results that 29.6% (Excellent) and 25.9% (Very Good) of the Alumni feels that that the other staff has always extended help enthusiastically.

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


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
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# Library

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
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
## Canteen facilities

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
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


## Alumni Association

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






# NSS/NCC/Extra Curricular Activities



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


#### 1. FEEDBACK ANALYSIS REPORT: STUDENT

Teachers are required to be regular in class so as to complete the syllabi in time. Most of the students stated that their teachers took classes regularly.

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


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
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Teachers prepare themselves well before teaching any class by upgrading their knowledge. The college library is equipped with offline as well as online teaching material for reference.

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




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
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Regular presentations, webinars, classroom discussions are the ways through which college adopts and encourages participative learning. Students are encouraged to be active participants in the teaching learning process.



It is essential to use suitable examples and illustrations to support the theory taught in class. 88% of the students maintained that their teachers gave adequate examples while teaching.

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


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

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


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
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Fair and unbiased evaluation is pertinent to improvement and check progress of the students. Teachers are fair in their evaluation of the students so that students get feedback regarding their work.

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
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


#### **EVALUATION OF STUDENT FEEDBACK (FORM 2B)**

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


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
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The classrooms, office and labs are provided power back up in case of a supply failure. A generator for uninterrupted power supply has been installed on the campus.

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


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
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A common room is also present on campus for the use by students.


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

A large majority of the students were of the opinion that the library start is helbful and courteous.

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


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
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The college campus is fully Wi-fi enabled and students can use the internet while on campus. Bandwidth in 2020-21?



A tuck shop is present on campus to cater to the needs of the students. They can get documents printed/photocopied conveniently, and also purchase stationery.

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


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
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The administrative staff is very cooperative with the students. Majority of the students agreed that the staff is helpful.

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


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
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It is our endeavor to promote cleanliness on the campus. Washrooms are cleaned periodically and dustbins have been placed on the campus.



Clean drinking is a must for any institution. Water coolers and purifiers have the various points in the campus for the convenience of the students.

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


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An Internal Complaints Committee has been set up to look into any grievance or complaint brought to notice.

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


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Creativity in the workplace helps one to come up with unique solutions to challenges and give novel ideas. As the chart depicts, all the responses showed agreement with creativity of the employees.

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

Performing well under pressure is a professional quality that helps employees to meet deadlines and act logically in emergency situations. A majority of the employers stated that their employees performed well even under stress.

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

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




### 3. FEEDBACK ANALYSIS REPORT: TEACHER



Q 5. The syllabus/course content of the subject augmented my knowledge and perspective in the subject area.



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
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




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






It is evident from the pie chart that more than 92% of teachers feel that the timetable is adjusted to cater to professional and personal needs.

Q 22. There are learning opportunities for career advancement in college.

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


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

Q 24. The online mode of teaching is as fulfilling as the traditional mode of teaching.





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

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
### 4. FEEDBACK ANALYSIS REPORT: ALUMNI

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
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- 1. Prospectus is also made available online for filling up of admission form through the link given on the College website.


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# LAB FACILITIES


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# **Teaching and Learning Process**

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
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# Other Staff

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


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# Career Counseling

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
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# Library

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
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# Canteen facilities

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
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# Alumni Association

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
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# Internet and Wi-Fi

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


# NSS/NCC/Extra curricular activities

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


# Grievance Handling


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# College Infrastructure


Nearly 90% students commented that their teachers encouraged participative learning during classes, with 8.3% being neutral.








About 70% of the students were satisfied with the cleanliness of the classrooms while the rest remained neutral.

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### 2. FEEDBACK ANALYSIS REPORT: TEACHER

#### EVALUATION OF TEACHER FEEDBACK

The highly qualified teaching faculty of the institution makes all-inclusive endeavors for the holistic growth of the students. The focus of the teachers' feedback has been regarding the syllabus content/curriculum, resources, environment, and infrastructural facilities available in the institution for the same.

#### Syllabus content/Curriculum

It was observed from the responses of the teachers that a considerable number of them were satisfied with the content and scope of the curriculum including the reference material available. However, they also expressed the need for regular revision and up gradation of the syllabus to make it more relevant with the frequently changing demands of the knowledge industry and society at large. They suggested imparting more of practical knowledge including field trips to support theoretical knowledge which would rather evaluate the students on the application of the content rather than just writing the theory after cramming. In short, they suggested more of correlation between theory and practical knowledge.

#### Resources for Teaching/Learning

The analysis of the teachers' feedback highlighted the adequate availability of resources for the attainment of best learning outcomes for the students. Majority of the mentioned and appreciated the sufficient library resources for the same including an ample number of books, journals, e-learning resources, ICT etc.

## Infrastructure facilities

The teachers expressed futuristic perceptions for better achievements of the students with the introduction of ICT enabled teaching/learning facilities in the institution. ICT resources have enhanced the scope of knowledge delivery system for the students. However, they also suggested the scope of better Wi-Fi facility in the institution. Though, they are satisfied with the infrastructural facilities available for them, they suggest some improvements in infrastructure for the students.

### Environment

Healthy and progressive work environment is the need of an hour. The college faculty is found to be highly satisfied with the overall environment of the college in which they are working and found it to be stress free, conducive and Co- operative. They are highly satisfied with the opportunities that they get on regular basis for participations, career advancements and their overall professional growth.

### Research Facilities

A significant number of teachers found availability of environment conducive for research in the institution which has also been enhanced with the set up of research laboratory therein. However, they also mentioned the scope of enrichment in the same for better research outputs for the students as well as the teachers.

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
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


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

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
### 4. FEEDBACK ANALYSIS REPORT: ALUMNI

- Online form filling assistance and facility has been provided within the campus for the students who are not computer proficient.

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
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

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




The response for lab facilities in the college, according to the alumni is very positive. It depicts that alumnae are satisfied with the lab facilities provided by the College.

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
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


### **Teaching and Learning Process**

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

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
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Library

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
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
#### Canteen facilities


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


#### **Alumni Association**

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
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#### Seminar /Workshop and Guest Lectures

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#### FEEDBACK: ACTION TAKEN REPORT (SESSION 2022-23)

(Based on the analysis of the feedback collected from various stakeholders during session 2021-22)

Our institute has an effective mechanism in place to obtain feedback from various stakeholders and we encourage them to provide us with thoughtful and constructive feedback.

Data was collected from the stakeholders through online feedback forms, with questions regarding the curriculum, faculty, and infrastructure of the college. Responses from the data collected were then analyzed and key suggestions/ concerns listed. It is our endeavor to take necessary measures to address the issues raised and efforts are made to strengthen the core areas of the college and on redressing various grievances.

#### KEY SUGGESTIONS/ CONCERNS/ ISSUES:

- During the session 2021-22, students were attending online classes, during which they faced many issues, related to internet connectivity and security.
- · It was suggested that the Wi-Fi facility available in the campus could be improved in terms of speed and better connectivity.
- Improvements in the hostel infrastructure and facilities were also suggested.
- A need for career counseling and placement was also felt so that students gain employability skills.
- Conducting more of student centric activities was also suggested as this leads to their physical, mental, and intellectual development and shapes their personality.

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### GURU GOBIND SINGH COLLEGE FOR WOMEN

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#### STEPS/ ACTIONS TAKEN:

- As the admission process is completely online, a dedicated helpdesk was set up in the campus to facilitate filling of forms. Online help as well as offline support was offered to students who faced difficulties in filling the form or paying the fee.
- Students returned to the campus for offline classes during this session. However, previously we were using G-suite for online classes and official IDs were provided to faculty and students for enhanced safety and security. Study material was shared with students through Google Classroom, which is being used for submission of assignments and projects presently.
- Library blog provides access to previous years question papers, learning material, library catalogue and e-resources.
- Value-added courses focus on meeting the needs of the contemporary dynamic business environment thus making the student more industry ready. These courses supplement students' learning and enhances their preparedness to meet the challenges of professional life. Keeping this in mind, 18 value added courses were run by various departments in the session.
- To bridge the gap between our students' skills and the expectations of the industry, the placement cell organized talks, workshops, and placement drives for the students. These activities not only imparted soft skills to the students but also addressed areas such as resume preparation, mock interviews, and personality development. The on-campus placement drives placed more than a hundred students in renowned companies.
- To enhance soft skills of students, workshops were organized and Value-added course in Communication Skills was conducted by the Post Graduate Department of English.
- Several MoU's were signed to strengthen our industrial links, which also help us to work jointly for mutual benefit and growth.

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**Principal** 

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- For the holistic development of students, a unique MoU was signed to establish Rekhi Centre of Excellence for the Science of Happiness in the college campus. It aims to promote research and practices of well-being for students as well as the faculty. Improved well-being further promotes students' academic performance, behaviour, social integration, and satisfaction.
- To promote student engagement and enhance their learning, activities were increased with an aim to nurture their potential. Workshops, seminars, and talks were regularly and frequently held for the benefit of both students and faculty. Such activities offer numerous benefits, such as improving communication skills, gaining expert knowledge and networking.
- With an aim to enhance classroom learning, several field visits were organized. These visits help to reinforce experiential and contextual learning for students and expose them to different settings and phenomena.
- The bandwidth for Wi-Fi was increased to 850 Mbps to provide seamless internet connectivity on the campus.
- Steps are already being taken to improve the infrastructure of Mata Kheevi hostel building. Order was placed with an architectural firm for the designing of hostel building Block A.

#### FEEDBACK: ACTION TAKEN REPORT (SESSION 2021-22)

(Based on the analysis of the feedback collected from various stakeholders during session 2020-21)

Our institution designs and collects feedback from various stakeholders to monitor and evaluate its performance quality on curriculum and related issues. The objective of collecting this feedback is to measure the impact of the efforts taken by the institution and to improve the quality of teaching-learning process. Data is collected from students through online feedback forms, with questions pertaining to the curriculum, faculty, and infrastructure of the college.

Feedback assessments with suggestions strengthen and help in achieving the vision and goal of the institution. Following are the constructive suggestions from various stakeholders with reference to curriculum, syllabi, teaching and learning along with the action taken.

### **Key Suggestions:**

- Due to COVID lockdown and following the norms of social distancing, classes were conducted online. Some students reported connectivity issues while attending these virtual classes.
- Lack of online educational resources was reported by students, which was a deterrent to the teaching- learning process.
- Course content/ syllabi needs to be updated and made more practical oriented.

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#### Action Taken:

- G-suite was used for online classes and official IDs were provided to faculty and students for enhanced safety and security during classes. Study material was shared promptly with students through Google Classroom.
- · The college library provided e-learning resources for use of students. The library blog (ggscwlibrary.blogspot.in) provides access to previous years question papers, current syllabi, departmental activities, etc.
- An athletic track was constructed around the multi-functional outdoor sports groundfor practice by the sports students.
- · Despite holding only online classes, several activities were held throughout the year to involve students and nurture their potential. These included webinars, online workshops, competitions, which kept the students engaged during the time of suspension of contact classes.
- To promote the mental health of students during lockdown, value added courses focussing on happiness, yoga and health were conducted in the online mode.
- Though the college cannot introduce changes in syllabi on its own, there is a mechanism in place for making suggestions. Our faculty members, who serve on the Board of Studies of their respective subjects can put forth their suggestions and views regarding changes to be introduced in the syllabi.

- 5 CCTVs were also placed in the campus for enhanced safety and security.
- A multi-functional outdoor sports ground was also constructed for practice of various sports.
- For better Wi-Fi connectivity, 10 access points were installed in the campus.
