

RASHTRIYA UCHCHATAR SHIKSHA ABHIYAN (RUSA) -IN TRANSFORMING QUALITY AND BRANDING IN HIGHER EDUCATION UT, CHANDIGARH

Strong system of education, especially higher education, is the corner stone of reaching a country's national goals. Infact, education has been recognized as the prime driver of the growth engine. In the present setup, quality of higher education has a special meaning in the context of knowledge economy to reap the demographic dividend of the youth population in the country. Efforts have to be made to make education relevant and acceptable to the modern industries. The global context of competitive economy cannot be lost sight of in regard to the role of higher education.

The Government of India has initiated Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA) mainly as quality interventions in higher education sector. The cardinal objectives of RUSA, the newly launched scheme in the education system of the country, are to achieve GER target of 25.2% by the end of the current plan period and 32% by the end of next five year plan period to improve the overall quality for the existing state higher education institutions, to correct regional imbalances regarding access to higher education, to improve equality in higher education, to ensure adequate availability of qualitative facilities in all higher educational institutions, to develop research–oriented and innovation environment and to integrate skill development through optimum interventions.

MHRD HAS LAID DOWN FOLLOWING TARGETS UNDER RUSA 2.0

- Increase the spending of States on higher education as a % of GSDP to 2% or above.
- Ensure all the State Institutions are NAAC Accredited by the end of March 2020 as a part of mandatory quality assurance framework.
- Reduce the student-teacher ratio to 15:1 in Institutions by the end of March 2020 Increasing the National GER to 32% by March 2022
- Ensure growth of GER with more inclusion of disadvantaged groups (SC/ST/Women) Ensure that all the States participate in AISHE and data pertaining to all State institutions is furnished.
- Ensure that the number of colleges affiliated to State Universities reduce to 200.

Important Instructions for Admission

- 1. Read the instructions and procedure thoroughly before filling the admission form for any course.
- 2. For the detailed admission schedule, candidate should refer to the website of the respective college where she/he has been allotted the seat online.
- 3. Candidates are required to be present physically on the day of admission and bring a 'Hard Copy' of the admission form along with the original documents and selfattested photocopies.
- 4. It is compulsory for the candidate to attend and deposit fee after taking admission in the 1st counselling in the respective allotted college, otherwise, he/she will lose the right to admission in the subsequent 2nd and 3rd counselling.
- 5. After 3rd counselling, subsequent allotment of the seat for centralized courses will be done by the college itself subject to availability of seats.
- If a reserve candidate falls under GENERAL CATEGORY merit list, the candidate will be given admission in the GENERAL CATEGORY only. So the candidate must report as per admission schedule of General Category on the date and time specified under General Category.
- 7. For Government Colleges: All the students seeking admission in B.A./M.A./M.Sc./PG Diploma courses also have to fill the admission form ONLINE at <u>www.dhe.chd.gov.in</u> For further admission procedure and schedule the student will refer to the website of the respective college.
- For Grant-in-Aid Colleges: All the students seeking admission in B.A./M.A./M.Sc./PG Diploma courses DO NOT have to fill the admission form at <u>www.dhe.chd.gov.in</u>. They will refer to the website of the respective college for instructions regarding filling of form.

Procedure to Apply Online (New Student)

(UG/PG Courses)

Instructions

- Visit the website <u>www.dhe.chd.gov.in</u> for online admission/application process.
- There is no offline mode to submit the application form.
- Download Joint Prospectus of Government and Grant in-Aid colleges.
- Read Prospectus carefully before applying for any course.
- Last date of applying is June 23, 2018 (Friday).
- **Help desks** will be set up in all the colleges from the very next day of the release of the prospectus, to help the candidates in filling up the online Admission forms.

Step 1: Online Registration

- 1. Click on the link e-Admissions (2018-19) on the website.
- 2. Click on **Sign Up** to register on website by filling email ID, Mobile Number and Name (Spellings of Name must be same as in Class-X marks sheet/certificate).
- 3. **Mobile Number** will be the Login ID and Password will be sent to your registered mobile number through SMS.
- 4. Candidate can change the password, if he/she desires.
- 5. Candidate will be able to Login to the admission portal by using the password in all future visits to this portal.
- 6. Pay **Registration Fee of Rs. 70/- online to proceed further to fill application form.** Note down the transaction number generated.
- 7. Payment verification will take maximum upto 24 hours. You can verify your payment by using the option **Payment Verification** on the website (Note: Transaction number will be used to verify the status of transaction).
- 8. A candidate can apply for Multiple Courses/Colleges with the same User id and Password.

Step 2: Login to apply for courses

- 1. Logon to the website <u>www.dhe.chd.gov.in</u> with your user id and password.
- 2. Click on APPLICATION FORM. Candidate will be asked two options:-

1) Degree Colleges 2) Professional College

3. Candidate will select his/her choice. Candidate will be asked two options:-

2) New Student 2) Old Student

- 4. Candidate applying for the first time for 1st year of courses in UG/PG courses will click on the link **New Student.**
- 5. Select <u>Centralized Admission</u> link for courses for which admissions are centralized and select <u>Non-Centralized</u> link for courses whose admission will be in respective colleges (Check Prospectus for details).
- 6. Instruction page will be displayed once the candidate selects the Course.
- 7. Read the rules and regulations thoroughly before filling the Application form.
- 8. The application form will be displayed to the candidate.

Step 3: Filling the Online Application Form

- 1. Candidate will have to fill details in various columns as required.
- 2. For centralized courses admission, candidates will have to submit preference of colleges. Based on preference, seat will be allotted on merit. After last date of applying, candidate will not be able to modify the preferences.
- 3. The application form has separate columns for Mother's Name and Father's Name. Both names have to be mentioned in the form. However, in case applicant doesn't wish to declare the name of either the Mother or the Father, he/she may not be forced to do so and no student will be denied admission on this ground.
- 4. Tick mark the **reserved category**, if any, and upload the valid supporting documents showing the name of the candidate. Certificates issued in the name of parents will not be valid. If the candidate has not tick marked on the specific reserved category, he/she cannot claim the seat in that category at the time of admission.
- 5. Applicant must fill Email ID (compulsory) and Email Ids of the parents (optional).
- 6. Applicant must fill his/her and the parents Telephone Number/Mobile Number (Applicant will receive acknowledgement of the filled Online Form through SMS on his/her mobile number only).
- 7. The column meant for hostel accommodation in the admission form should be filled with YES or NO. There is no separate form for hostel admission. If the candidate does not opt for hostel in the form then he/she cannot claim the hostel seat at the time of admission.
- 8. In case candidate applies for hostel accommodation, he/she must fill complete particulars of **local Guardian** (resident of Chandigarh/Mohali/Panchkula only).
- 9. Applicant must fill Bank Name, Account Number, IFSC Code of Branch and Aadhar card number (If allotted), EPIC number (Voter Card number) (if allotted).
- 10. For admission, **fraction of marks** less than the requisite percentage will not be rounded off to the advantage of the candidates i.e. 32.9%, 39.9% and 49.9% will not be rounded off to 33%, 40% and 50% respectively.
- 11. The full name of the **Board/University** from which the last examination has been passed is to be given e.g. **Punjab School Education Board instead of PSEB**.
- 12. Candidate will be able to view and can modify the information before final submission of the online application form. After final submission on the last day to apply, modification of form will be locked.
- 13. The applicant should note the **Application Form No.** generated after online form submission.
- 14. In case any deficiency is found at the time of scrutiny of the form regarding any information given/documents required to be uploaded, an SMS will be sent to the Candidate on his/her registered mobile number.
- 15. Candidate's form will be unlocked and he/she will be able to upload the additional document demanded on receiving the SMS regarding deficiency, if any.
- 16. Application form submitted after due date or **incomplete** in any respect will not be accepted.
- 17. The declaration given in the admission form to be downloaded after allotment of college should also be signed by the Parent/Guardian.

Step 4: Upload Certificates/Testimonials, Scanned Photograph and Signature

- 1. One set of scanned original testimonials/certificates should be uploaded (in .pdf format only) with the admission form:-
 - Matriculation Certificate for Date of Birth.
 - 10+2 Detailed Marks Certificate.

- University/ Board DMC of the lower examination.
- Character Certificate from the institution last attended or from a gazetted officer in case of private candidates. (Specimen of the form is given at the end of the Prospectus)
- Migration Certificate/ Inter-University Migration Certificate.
- Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe/Physically Challenged Persons/Sports/Defence/ Freedom Fighter's Ward/Kashmiri Displaced Person's Ward/Descendants of Kargil Martyrs/Single Girl Child/One out of only Two Girl Children/Cancer/AIDS/ Thalassemia Patients/Border Area/Rural Area/Excelled in Youth Festival.
- Sports Gradation Certificate from Chandigarh Sports Department for both U.T Pool and General Pool Candidates.
- Equivalence certificate from Panjab University of the last course passed by the candidate (where required).

2. Candidates are also required to upload:

- Scanned passport size photo of the applicant (not more than 50kb).
- Scanned signature of the applicant (not more than 50kb).

Other important instructions

- 1. Students will only be able to download Provisional Admission Form after the display of allotment of colleges on 7th July 2018.
- 2. Students are advised to keep a **photocopy** of the **filled Provisional Admission Form** and bring it on the day of admission.
- 3. Candidates are required to bring all the original certificates at the time of admission.
- 4. The admission will be based on merit, which will be calculated on the basis of marks obtained in qualifying examination.
- 5. Weightage, wherever applicable, would be given as per Panjab University norms.
- 6. Two affidavits, in original, are to be attached with the application form in case of gap year/years, if any (Specimen of the affidavit is given at the end of the Prospectus). Candidates with gap year will not be admitted to any college until the gap is explained to the satisfaction of the convener of the respective admission committee of the concerned college, by submitting an affidavit as per the specimen given at the end of the Prospectus. Scanned copy of the original affidavit is also required to be uploaded in .pdf format.
- 7. The documents uploaded by the candidate will be scrutinized to confirm that there is no shortcoming or deficiency in the application form. Candidate will be able to check the status of his/her application online with his/her password on the admission portal in this regard.
- 8. No separate communication will be sent to the applicants for attending the physical counselling and all the information/updates will be available on the website and the online prospectus.
- 9. All the Admitted students are required to submit online the Anti-Ragging Undertaking at the Anti-Ragging Web Portal of Government of India <u>www.antiragging.in</u> and submit the unique id/copy of undertaking generated online in the college office.

Procedure to Apply Online (Old Student) (UG/PG Courses)

(For Old students of Government Colleges only)

Note: Old students of Government Aided privately managed colleges may refer to the respective college prospectus and website for the admission procedure.

- 1. Visit the website **www.dhe.chd.gov.in** and download prospectus of Government and Grant in-Aid colleges.
- 2. Study it thoroughly before applying for any course.
- 3. Click on the link **e-Admissions (2018-19)** on the website **www.dhe.chd.gov.in** for further process.
- 4. This will take the user to www.dhe.chd.gov.in/eAdmission for further process.
- 5. Click on LOG IN.
- 6. Click on **APPLICATION FORM**. Candidate will be asked two options **New Student** or **Old Student**.
- 7. Old Students will click on Old Student link.
- 8. Instructions page will be displayed on selection of the **Old Student** link.
- 9. Candidate will be asked to select his/her college and enter **Roll No**. and **Date of Birth**.
- 10. Candidate's pre-filled information will be displayed on the screen.
- 11. Candidate will be required to fill his/her result of previous class and submit the form.
- 12. Candidates are also required to upload:
 - Scanned passport size photo of the applicant (not more than 50kb).
 - Scanned signature of the applicant (not more than 50kb).
- 13. Candidate will be able to view and can modify the information before final submission of the online application form.
- 14. After final submission modification of form will be locked.
- 15. Candidates are required to Print the Form and submit the same to the Admission Committee in their respective college at the time of admission.
- 16. All the Admitted students are required to submit online the Anti-Ragging Undertaking at the Anti-Ragging Web Portal of Government of India www.antiragging.in and submit the unique id/copy of undertaking generated online in the college office.

Rules & Regulations Governing Admissions

- The candidates are to be admitted strictly in accordance with the rules and regulations contained in the **latest** Panjab University calendar/guidelines/any other instructions which have been issued/may be issued by the University from time to time for the respective courses/examinations and in order of merit.
- 2. All the admissions to these institutions are provisional and subject to the approval of the Panjab University. The institution cannot be held responsible in case the University does not approve the admission of a student on account of giving incomplete information, concealing necessary facts or attaching incomplete testimonials or choosing wrong combination of subjects or delayed submission of certificates etc. The fine/penalty imposed by Panjab University for any default in this regard shall be the personal responsibility of the student.
- 3. All candidates found eligible for admission will have to **appear in person** before the Admission Committee on the dates notified in the prospectus. A candidate who does not attend the interview shall not be admitted.
- 4. Any instructions or rules received from the Director Higher Education, Chandigarh Administration/Panjab University, after the publication of this prospectus, will be binding on the students.
- 5. Students disqualified by any University/Board shall not be admitted.
- 6. Concealment of facts/furnishing of false information in the Admission form will lead directly to the cancellation of admission and the amount deposited as fee will be forfeited.

7. For Hostel Admission

- a. The column meant for hostel accommodation in the admission form should be filled with YES or NO.
- b. It is mandatory for the parent/guardian of the candidate to be present at the time of admission.

8. Late Admission

- a. Permission of the Vice-Chancellor, Panjab University is necessary for admission after the expiry of the last date for admission given with the Principal's permission.
- b. A student, whose result of 10+2 examination has not been declared by the School Board, may be admitted without late fee within 15 working days of the declaration of the result, depending upon the availability of seats and the fact that the Admission Form has been submitted as 'Result Awaited Case' before the last date of submission of Admission Forms. The attendance of such a student shall be counted from the date of admission. This would be applicable to Open School also. After expiry of this period, late admission approval from the Vice-Chancellor is required.
- c. In case of late declaration of result by Panjab University, normal admission will take place within 10 working days of declaration of the result. This rule will not apply to a candidate who passes the lower examination from any other University/Board.

9. Re-admission

- a. A student who remains absent for more than 10 days at a stretch, including holidays, in one or more than one subjects/periods, without sanctioned leave is liable to have his/her name struck off from the college rolls.
- b. If a student's name is struck off from the college rolls, he/she will be required to seek re-admission within 10 working days failing which his/her admission will stand cancelled.

- c. Re-admission fee of Rs. 150/- will be charged. It is mandatory for the student to bring his/her parent at the time of re-admission.
- d. Re-admission is not the right of every student. It is the prerogative of the Principal of the respective college and it is allowed for not more than two times per semester/per session.
- e. The attendance of the student seeking re-admission will however be counted from the first day of teaching and not from the date of re-admission.

10. Withdrawal of Admission and Refund of Fee

In partial modification of office order no. DPI-UT-CS-12(6)95 dated 30-3-07/24-4-07, the Advisor to the Administrator, Union Territory, Chandigarh is pleased to adopt the recommendations of the Registrar, Panjab University, Chandigarh endorsed vide no. 4721-4900/Misc/A-3 dated 28-5-07 regarding refund of entire fee collected from the students withdrawing before the starting of the course, the candidates in the waiting list would be given admission against the vacant seat. The entire fee collected from the student, after a deduction of the processing fee of not more than Rs.1000/- (Rupees one thousand only) shall be refunded and returned by the institution/University to the student/candidate withdrawing from the programme. In case a student leaves after joining the course and if the seat consequently falling vacant has been filled by another candidate by the last date of admission, the institution must return the fee collected with proportionate deduction of monthly fee and proportionate hostel rent, where applicable, as conveyed by University Grant Commission, New Delhi vide their letter no. F.No. 1-3/2007(CPP-II) dated 23rd April 2007. **The processing fee will not be refunded**.

Note: Notwithstanding anything contained in this document to the contrary, the "<u>Instructions for Admission to Various Courses</u>" of Panjab University, Chandigarh or any subsequent instructions to be issued by Panjab University for the session 2017-18 shall apply.

11. Migration

Students from other **colleges affiliated to Panjab University** may be allowed to migrate with the prior permission of the concerned Principals and as per the University rules and regulations. The candidate has to submit **College Leaving Certificate** from the previous college along with the other certificates.

Candidates require Migration Certificate when:

- a. They are not from Panjab University.
- b. No migration will be permitted to a student with a combination of Subjects not provided in these colleges.
- c. Mid-term migration from any other university is not allowed.

12. Deficient Subjects

A candidate who has passed his/her 1st and 2nd Semester of B.A./B.Sc.(General)/B.Com/ B.B.A./B.C.A. course conducted by another University/College affiliated to another University in India under specific authorisation by the University concerned, be allowed to migrate to a College affiliated to Panjab University/Department of evening Studies/ University School of Open Learning in the 3rd Semester/5th Semester of the respective Course (as per rules prescribed under Chapter XIV- "Migration of Students' <u>Page No 247</u> to 262 of P.U. calendar Volume-III, (2009) on the condition that such a candidate will have to clear the Deficient Subject/s if any, within the permissible chances.

Deficiencies should be determined by the Principal/Chairperson at the time of admission under intimation to University (i.e. on the registration Return and examination forms) as well as to the students as per University rule No.6 given at

Page 261 of P.U. Calendar. Vol.III, 2009.

- a. A Candidate seeking admission to any college after migration from Universities **other than** the Panjab University shall clear deficient subjects, if any, as determined by the College/University.
- b. Deficient subject is one which is not passed by the candidate in the previous institution in that class and is required to be qualified for admission to next higher class.
- c. The candidate should be asked to furnish the details of the courses he/she has covered in his/her previous institution, i.e. course contents etc. And that should be certified by the Principal/competent authority of the previous institution.
- d. In case of students who have passed their B.A./B.Sc./B.Com./B.B.A./B.C.A. part I/II examination from Universities other than those from the Punjab State there should be no deficient subjects. In case the student had covered more that 50% of the syllabus prescribed by the Panjab University in a subject it shall not be treated to be a deficient subject.
- **13. Foreign Students** All Foreign Students shall obtain Eligibility Certificate from Deputy Registrar (General) Panjab University in all cases and the admission of the foreign students to College/Teaching Departments would be governed by the Guidelines issued by the Dean Foreign Students. The eligibility form should be accompanied by a forwarding letter from the Principal of the College/ Chairperson of the Teaching Department indicating the reason for denying the admission to the candidate. After obtaining the Eligibility Certificate, the candidate should submit the same to College/department where he/she is seeking admission.

Checklist of Documents for Foreign Students

- 1. Original Passport / Visa. (wherever applicable)
- 2. Valid Student Visa
- 3. A certificate of registration from the local police.
- 4. Date of Birth Certificate with the Father's/Mother's name
- 5. An eligibility certificate from the Panjab University to desired course
- 6. Original letter of certificate from present institution
- 7. Original Migration Certificate
- 8. Academic certificates and testimonials.
- 9. Original letters of scholarships in case of those who are Government of India sponsored scholars.

The respective college authorities have the right to reject any admission form and refuse admission if there is any discrepancy in the name, date of birth or even spellings of the names in passport, certificates, testimonials and birth certificate etc.

Eligibility Conditions for all Courses

MASTER OF ARTS (M.A.)

- 1. Admission will be made strictly in order of merit
- For admission to M.A. (1st semester). In case the College/Department decides to hold Entrance Tests at their level, the following procedure will be followed besides the rules/regulations of Panjab University governing eligibility in a particular subject.

(i) Academic Weightage	60%
a. 10th Class	10%
b. 10+2 Class	10%
c. B.A. / B.Sc. / B.Com.	40%
(ii) Written and Oral Test / Aptitude Test	40%

MASTER OF COMMERCE (M.Com.)

A person who possesses one of the following qualifications shall be eligible to join the course:

1. A Bachelor's degree in Commerce with not less than 45% marks in aggregate;

OR

2. B Com (Honours) degree with not less than 45% marks in aggregate;

OR

3. A Bachelor's degree with Honours in Economics/Mathematics/Statistics/Commerce with not less than 45% in aggregate;

OR

4. A Bachelor's degree with 50% marks in aggregate having offered Economics/ Mathematics/Statistics/Commerce as a subject in the examination.

In case of a candidate having Bachelor's degree of the University through Modern Indian Language [Hindi/Urdu/Punjabi/Gurumukhi Script] and/or in a Classical Language (Sanskrit/Persian/Arabic) or degree of any other University obtained in the same manner recognized by the Panjab University Syndicate, 50% marks in aggregate shall be calculated by taking into account full percentage of marks in all the papers in Language excluding the additional optional paper, English and the elective subject taken together;

OR

5. An associate of (i) Institute of Chartered Accountants of India or England **or** (ii) Institute of Cost and Works Accountants of India or England.

OR

6. Pass in the final examination conducted by the Institute of Company Secretaries of India.

OR

- 7. Any other qualification recognized by Panjab University Syndicate for the purpose.
- A candidate who seeks admission on the basis of qualifications mentioned in (3), (4) and (5)

above shall be required to qualify a special examination in two papers on (i) Commercial and Taxation Laws, and (ii) Accounting and Auditing, within one year from the date of Admission (either in Semester I or in Semester II examination), in accordance with the Syllabus prescribed by the Panjab University Senate.

Further, the maximum marks shall be 100 in each paper and the pass marks shall be 35% as in B.Com Examination. There shall be no internal assessment in these papers and marks obtained in these papers will not be counted in the Semester examination.

MASTER OF ENTREPRENEURSHIP AND FAMILY BUSINESS (MEFB)

As per rules and regulations of Panjab University, all students who have passed Bachelors/ Master's degree in any discipline with not less than 50% marks in aggregate or pass in final examination conducted by Institute of Chartered Accounts of India or IC.W.A. or I.C.S.I are eligible for admission . Admission will be made on the basis of entrance Test PU-CET (PG) + Merit (50% weightage to entrance 50% weightage to qualifying exam).

MASTER OF PHYSICAL EDUCATION (M.P.Ed.)

(Approved by NCTE vide Letter No. F.NRC/NCTE F-7/CH-32/148 MEETING/2009) dated 31 Aug., 2009

Reservation for UT/General Pool: 60:40

Eligibility

A person who possesses one of the following qualifications shall be eligible to join the course:-

(a) Candidates who have obtained at least fifty percent marks in the B.P.Ed. Degree/or B.Sc. degree in Physical Education, Health Education and Sports from Panjab University are eligible for admission.

OR

(b) Bachelor's Degree of Physical Education (after Graduation)/Post-Graduation Diploma in Physical Education of another University recognized by the Panjab University obtaining not less than 50% marks.

OR

(c) A Bachelor's Degree of Physical Education (Four Year degree after 10+2) of any other University recognized by Panjab University obtaining not less than 50% marks.

OR

(d) Any other qualification recognized by the Syndicate as equivalent to (a), (b) or (c).

Provided that a candidate admitted under any of the clauses (a) to (d) qualifies in the Standard Physical Efficiency Test.

- Admission to M.P.Ed. Course will be on the basis of Written Entrance Test. Seventy five multiple choice questions based on B.P.Ed. syllabus and Current Events will be set for the Entrance Test. There will be no negative marking. Over written answers will not be evaluated.
- 2. Additional Sports weightage will be as per clause 18.2 of Handbook of Panjab University, Chandigarh.

Provided that a candidate considered for admission under any of the above clauses

 to (iii) qualifies in the Coopers' 12 minute/ 9 minute run/ walk test for boys and girls respectively at the time of admission to this course and he/she is required to score minimum 45% of marks of the maximum score obtained by the examinee.

Note:

- 1. Merit for M.P.Ed.-First Year will be determined on the basis of 50% marks obtained in the **qualifying examination and 50% of the marks obtained in the written test.**
- 2. Due weightage shall be given in the field of sports/NCC/NSS and proficiency in the game/sports of choice etc. as per the guidelines of the Chandigarh Administration/ Panjab University, Chandigarh.

MASTER OF SCIENCE (M.Sc.)

Applied Chemistry (Pharmaceutical)

As per rules and regulations of Panjab University, all students who have passed B.Sc. with Chemistry, B.Tech. (Chemical Engg. & Technology), B.Pharma. with not less than 55% marks in aggregate are eligible for admission. Admission will be made on the merit basis.

Botany

As per rules and regulations of Panjab University, all students who have passed B.Sc. with Botany, having at least 50% marks in aggregate, from Panjab University or any other recognized university are eligible for admission. Admission will be made on the basis of combined merit of CET (P.G.) (conducted by Panjab University) and B.Sc. examination.

Chemistry

As per rules and regulations of Panjab University, B.Sc. (Medical/Non-Medical) candidates who have passed the said examination securing 50% marks in aggregate and also 50% marks in the subject of Chemistry separately are eligible for admission as per rules and regulations of Panjab University. The candidates, who have passed B.Sc. (Medical) examination, shall be required to study Mathematics in the first as well as 2nd semester and those who have passed B.Sc. (Non-Medical) examination shall be required to study Biology in the first and 2nd semester. Admission will be made on basis of combined merit of CET (P.G.) conducted by Panjab University, Chandigarh and B.Sc. examination (50:50).

Physics

As per rules and regulations of Panjab University, all students who have passed B.Sc. Degree with Physics and Mathematics are eligible for admission as per rules and regulations of Panjab University. Admission will be made on the basis of combined merit of P.U.-CET (P.G.) and B.Sc. examination.

Zoology

As per rules and regulations of Panjab University, all students who have passed B.Sc. with Zoology having at least 50% marks in aggregate from Panjab University or any other

recognized university are eligible for admission. Admission will be made on the basis of combined merit of P.U.-CET (P.G.) and B.Sc. examination.

MASTER OF SCIENCE IN INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY (M.Sc. IT)

A person who has passed one of the following examinations shall be eligible to join Part I of the course:

- i. B.C.A. examination from Panjab University.
- ii. B.E./B.Tech. in Computer Science/Information Technology from Panjab University.
- iii. B.C.A./B.Sc. (Hons) in Computer Science/B.Sc. (H.S.) in Mathematics & Computing or any other graduation with Computer Science/IT/Computer Applications and Mathematics in all three years of graduation
- iv. Any examination from another University recognized by Panjab University, Chandigarh as equivalent to any of the above examinations.

MASTER OF SCIENCE IN BIOTECHNOLOGY

Admission will be on the basis of entrance test CET-(P.G.) conducted by the Panjab University. Only the rank holders in the entrance test will be considered for admission. 50% weightage will be given to the score in entrance test & 50% to the score in the qualifying examination.

Bachelor's degree (under the 10+2+3) in Physical, Biological, Pharmaceutical, Agricultural, Veterinary or Fishery Sciences or Bachelor's degree in Engineering / Technology, Home Science, Medicine (MBBS) from any University / Institute recognized by Panjab University. The candidate must have obtained 55% marks at the Bachelor's degree level.

MASTER OF SCIENCE IN MICROBIAL BIOTECHNOLOGY

A candidate must have Bachelor's degree from any field of Biological Sciences including Biotechnology is eligible to seek admission in M.Sc. Microbial Biotechnology. The admission will be based on 50% score in Entrance Test (CET-PG) conducted by the Panjab University and 50% marks in qualifying exam.

WEIGHTAGES

- I. 15% weightage will be given for Honours subject for pursuing M.A/M.Sc/M.Com courses in the related subject.
- II. 5% weightage for graduate student of Panjab University.

The minimum qualification for admission to First Semester of the course shall be:

 A Bachelor's/Postgraduate degree in any discipline of the Panjab University or a degree of any other University which has been recognized by the Syndicate as equivalent thereto with not less than 45% marks in the aggregate: Provided that in case of candidates having Bachelor's degree of the University

through Modern Indian Languages [Hindi/Urdu/Panjabi (Gurumukhi Script) and/or in a Classical Language Sanskrit/Persian/Arabic] or a degree of any other University obtained in the same manner, recognized by the Syndicate 45% marks in the aggregate shall be calculated by taking into account full percentage of marks in all the papers in Language excluding the additional optional paper, English and the elective subject taken together.

A pass in the final examination conducted by the (a) Institute of Chartered Accountants of India or Institute of Chartered Accountants of England and Wales, or (b) Institute of Cost & and Works Accounts of India or Institute of Cost & Management Accountants incorporated by Royal Charter, London, or (c) Institute of

Company Secretaries of India.

OR

iii. AMIE examination with at least 50% marks.

ADMISSION TO P.G. COURSES FOR B.VOC. GRADUATES

Eligibility Conditions for Undergraduate Courses

BACHELOR OF ARTS (B.A.)

- 1. A candidate who has passed one of the following examinations with English as one of the subjects shall be eligible to join the first Semester class of B.A. degree course in a College affiliated to Panjab University. However, a candidate who has not qualified English as one of the subjects at the 10+2 examinations shall be eligible to join B.A. 1st semester only provisionally, subject to his/her qualifying the deficient subject of English from the parent Board/Body/Council/University in two consecutive chances subsequent to his/her admission, failing which his/her admission to B.A. 1st Semester and the result for the examination shall automatically stand cancelled.
 - i. B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. Part-I (Old Scheme)/ Intermediate/Arts/Science/Agriculture examination of Panjab University.
 - ii. The 10+2 examination under 10+2+3 system of education of a recognized University/Board/Council.
 - iii. PrakShastri/Vishard examination with compulsory English. (Vide Senate Para-LXXVII dated 06.12.2009)
 - iv. Any other examination recognized by Panjab University as equivalent to (i), (ii) and (iii) above.

Provided further that a student shall be eligible to opt for the subject of Computer Science at the B.A. level if he/she has passed the +2 examination with Science/Commerce/ Economics/Mathematics and Computer related subject like Computer/Information technology etc. as one of the elective subjects or optional subjects.

NOTE: The candidates who have passed computer related subject like Computer science/Information Technology, etc. as one of the Elective subjects or optional subject at 10+2 level, be allowed to opt for the subject of Computer Science at B.A. level w.e.f. the academic session 2012-13 (Syndicate Para 18 dated 27.09.2011).

- 2. A candidate who has been placed under compartment in 10+2 examination conducted by a Board / Body / Council / University in India shall be eligible to seek admission to the First Semester of B.A. course/s provided he/she fulfills the following conditions:

 - ii. He/she should have obtained at least 20% marks in the subject in which he/she had been placed in compartment.

- A candidate who has passed 10+2 examination from State Board/CBSE/ICSE or any other recognized Board/ University, shall be eligible to seek admission to B.A. 1st Semester. The admission shall be made on the basis of merit and according to the Panjab University and Chandigarh Administration rules.

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NOTE: Candidates securing less than 20% marks in the subject of compartment in the 10+2 examination be made eligible to join B.A. Part 1 course, if they clear or secure 20% or more marks in the subject in the Supplementary Examination held in July / August, on or before the last date for admission with late fee with the permission of the Vice-Chancellor, provided the seat/s is/are available (Syndicate para 43 (xiv) meeting held on 27-01-2013).

BACHELOR OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION (B.B.A.)

- 1. Admission to the 1st semester of B.B.A. Degree Course shall be open to a person who has passed one of the following examinations conducted by a recognized Board/Council /University:
 - a. 10+2 examination securing at least 50% marks in aggregate.
 - b. Any other examination recognized by Panjab University as equivalent to (a) as given above with required percentage of marks.

Provided that a candidate seeking admission to the 1st semester should have cleared in the subject of English at 10+2 examination and in cases where passing in English is not necessary according to the regulations of certain Boards/Bodies/Councils/ Universities in India, the admission of the candidate shall be provisional and will be confirmed only after he/she has cleared the subject of English as a deficient subject from the parent Board/Body/Council/ University in two consecutive chances subsequent to his/her admission. In case a candidate does not clear the relevant subject at any of the two consecutive chances allowed to him/her subsequent to the date of his/her admission, his/her provisional admission to the course shall stand cancelled.

Provided further that:

A candidate who has been placed under compartment in 10+2 examination conducted by a Board/Bodies/Councils/University in India shall be eligible to seek admission to the 1st semester of B.B.A. course, provided he/she fulfills the following conditions:

- i. He/she should have been placed in compartment in one subject only.
- ii. He/she should have obtained at least 20% marks in the subject in which he /she had been placed in under compartment.
- iii. He/she should have obtained the required percentage of marks in aggregate of the examination as laid down in the relevant regulations.

Admission of the candidate with a compartment, as indicated above, shall be provisional and will be confirmed only after he/she has cleared the compartment in two consecutive chances subsequent to his/her admission. In case the candidate does not clear the compartment in any of the two consecutive chances allowed to him/her subsequent to the date of his admission, his/her provisional admission to the course shall stand cancelled.

- Admission to the 1st semester of B.Com. Degree Course shall be open to a person who has passed one of the following examinations conducted by a recognized Board / Council /University:
 - a. 10+2 examination or B.Com.- Part-I (Old scheme) of Panjab University with three of the following subjects securing at least 45% marks in aggregate:
 - i. Commerce (or Theory of Commerce or Foundation Course in Commerce)
 - ii. Accountancy (or Book Keeping and Accountancy)
 - iii. Economics
 - iv. Business Organization (or Business Management or Theory and Practice of Management).
 - v. Insurance (or General Insurance or Life Insurance)
 - vi. Banking and Trade
 - vii. Commercial Geography
 - viii. Office Management and Secretarial Practice (or Office Organization and Management)
 - ix. Mercantile Law (or any Company Law)
 - x. Auditing
 - xi. Typewriting and Stenography/Computers (for typewriting)
 - b. 10+2 Examination or B.A. Part-I (Old Scheme) of Panjab University with at least two of the subjects mentioned in (a) securing at least 50% marks in aggregate;
 - c. 10+2 Examination or B.A. Part-I/B.Sc.-I/Pre-Engineering/Pre-Medical Examination of Panjab University (Old Scheme) not covered in (b) securing at least 50% marks.
 - d. Any other examination recognized by Panjab University as equivalent to a) or b) or c) as given above with required percentage of marks given under each clause.

Provided that a candidate seeking admission to the 1st semester of B.Com. should have cleared the subject of English at 10+2 examination and in cases where passing in English is not necessary according to the regulations of certain Boards/Bodies/ Councils/ Universities in India, admission of the candidate shall be provisional and will be confirmed only after he/she has cleared the subject of English as a deficient subject from the parent Board/Body/Council/University in two consecutive chances subsequent to his admission. In case a candidate does not clear the relevant subject in any of the two consecutive chances allowed to him /her subsequent to the date of his/her admission, his/her provisional admission to the course shall stand cancelled.

Provided further that:

A candidate who has been placed under compartment in 10+2 examination conducted by a Board/Bodies/Councils/University in India shall be eligible to seek admission to the 1st semester of B.Com. course, provided he/she fulfills the following conditions:

- i. He/she should have been placed under compartment in one subject only.
- ii. He/she should have obtained at least 20% marks in the subject in which he/she had been placed under compartment.
- iii. He/she should have obtained the requisite percentage of marks in aggregate of the examination as laid down in the relevant regulations.

Admission of the candidate with a compartment, as indicated above, shall be provisional and will be confirmed only after he/she has cleared the compartment in two consecutive chances subsequent to his/her admission. In case the candidate does not

Eligibility Criteria for Bachelor of Commerce 3rd Semester & 5th Semester

The candidate who is admitted in first/third/fifth semester will be allowed to be promoted to second/fourth/sixth semester respectively. However, for promotion from second to third or from fourth to fifth semester the candidate will have to clear 50% of the total papers till that semester. It is further clarified that for calculating 50% fraction, like, 2.5, 3.5 or 4.5 will be considered 3, 4 or 5 respectively.

BACHELOR OF COMMMERCE (HONOURS)

Student having secured at least 50% marks in aggregate in B.Com 1st Semester & 2nd Semester on basis of merit, subject to the availability of seats.

BACHELOR OF COMPUTER APPLICATIONS (B.C.A.)

Admission to B.C.A. shall be open to:

1. A person who has passed 10+2 examination in any discipline with at least 50% marks and passed Mathematics as one of the subject at Matriculation examination level shall be eligible to join the 1st semester class of B.C.A. Course.

OR

2. Has passed any other examination recognized by Panjab University Syndicate as equivalent to (1) above.

Provided further that:

A candidate who has been placed under compartment in the +2 examination conducted by a Board/Bodies/Councils/University in India shall be eligible to seek admission to the First Semester of BCA course, provided he/she fulfills the following conditions:-

(i) He/she should have been placed compartment in one subject only;

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(ii) He/she should have obtained at least 20% marks in the subject in which he/she has been placed in compartment ; and

(iii) He/she should have obtained the requisite percentage of marks in the aggregate of the examination as laid down in the relevant regulations.

The admission of the candidate with a compartment as indicated above shall be provisional and will be confirmed only after he/she has cleared the compartment in two consecutive chances subsequent to his/her admission. In case the candidate does not clear the compartment at any of the two consecutive chances allowed to him/her subsequent to the date of his/her admission, his/her provisional admission to the course shall stand cancelled.

Explanation: - In case of a compartment candidate, eligibility shall be determined by including the marks of the subject in which the candidate has been placed under compartment.

(A) Subject to the reservation made by the University, the admission shall be on merit

Note:

- I. 10% weightage will be given for each subject of Mathematics/Statistics and Computer Science/Computer Applications/Information Technology or equivalent to the candidate who studied the subject at 10+2 level at the time of admission in B.C.A. 1st semester from the admissions of 2015.
- II. 20% weightage in total will be given to those students who have studied Mathematics/Statistics and Computer Science or Computer Applications or Information Technology or Information System at 10+2 level.

BACHELOR OF PHYSICAL EDUCATION (B.P.Ed.) TWO YEARS COURSE

Admission to B.P.Ed. shall be open to any person who has passed one of the following examinations:

1. Bachelor's degree in any discipline with 50% marks and having participated in Inter-College/Inter-Zonal/District/School competition in sports and games as recognized by the AIU/IOA/SGFI/Govt. of India.

OR

2. Bachelor's degree in Physical Education with 45% marks.

OR

3. Bachelor's degree in any discipline with 45% marks with Physical Education as Compulsory/Elective subject.

OR

4. Bachelor's degree with 45% marks and having participated in National/Inter University/ State competitions or secured 1st, 2nd or 3rd position in Inter College/Inter-Zonal/ District/School competition in sports and games as recognized by the AIU/IOA/SGFI/ Govt. of India.

OR

5. Bachelor's degree with participation in International competitions or secured 1st, 2nd or 3rd position in National/Inter-University competition in sports and games as recognized by respective federations AIU/IOA/SGFI/Govt. of India.

OR

6. Graduation with 45% marks and at least three years of teaching experience (for deputed in-service candidates i.e. trained physical education teachers/coaches).

Relaxation in the percentage of marks in the qualifying examination and in the reservation of seats for SC/ST/OBC and other categories shall be as per the rules of the Central Government/State Government, whichever is applicable.

Admission to B.P.Ed. 3rd semester will be done in accordance with the new guidelines issued by Panjab University. Students should have passed previous semester from colleges affiliated to Panjab University. New Admissions will be subject to the availability of seats in the respective colleges.

B.P.Ed. (FOUR YEAR INNOVATIVE / INTEGRATED TEACHER EDUCATION PROGRAM)

Reservation for UT/ General Pools: 60:40

Age Limit: 16 to 24 Years

- 1. 45% marks in fitness test are required.
- 2. Original documents will be required for verification.
- 3. State Sports Department graded sports achievement/participation certificates are required under sports quota admissions in games/sports recognized by Association of Indian Universities (AIU).
- 4. Medical certificate from Govt. Hospital for physical fitness test on a prescribed proforma designed by Govt. Multi-Specialty Hospital Sector 32, Chandigarh is mandatory. The proforma will be available in the department of physical education.
- 5. 10+2 from recognized Board/Council/University with 45 % in aggregate.
- 6. Two year Diploma in Physical Education years from any recognized University/Institution or any equivalent qualification recognized by Panjab University Chandigarh with 45 % marks in aggregate.
- 7. Age should not be more than 24 years as on 1st September 2017. Relaxation in age up to 25 years will be given in case of National/International position holder candidates/SC/ST subject to qualifying the standard physical fitness/efficiency, test i.e. Coopers 12 minute/9minute run/walk test for boys and girls respectively. He/she will be required to score minimum 45 % marks of the maximum score obtained by the examinee.

Internship

Three months internship in schools is mandatory in the Fourth Year of B.P.Ed. course for the successful completion of degree without which Panjab University shall not declare the result or award the Degree of Bachelor of Physical Education.

Cultural/Music/Hobby Activities in B.P.Ed. - Fifth Semester and Fourth Year Third Year and Fourth Year students of B.P.Ed. are required to attend 80 (Eighty) Hours per session as a qualifier for B.P.Ed. Degree.

Note: Students admitted to B.P.Ed. Course will have to take prior permission for participation in National/State level Competitions from the HOD, Department of Physical Education and the Principal of the concerned college along with consent from their parents. If student/s do not take the required permissions, they will be responsible for the shortage of attendance, if any.

Important Note: For subject details of B.P.Ed. 1st, 3rd & 5th (Semester System), and Fourth Year (Annual System) may refer to the website www.puchd.ac.in (Complete Syllabi- Education-Physical Education)

Medium of Examination

Three sets of question papers will be set offering English, Punjabi and Hindi mediums.

Eligibility

Candidate who is admitted to the $1^{st}/3^{rd}/5^{th}/7^{th}$ semester will be allowed to be promoted to the $2^{nd}/4^{th}/6^{th}/8^{th}$ semester respectively. However, for promotion from the 2^{nd} to 3^{rd} or from the 4^{th} to the 5^{th} semester & 6^{th} to 7^{th} the candidate will have to clear 50% of the total papers till that semester. It is further clarified that for calculating 50% fractions like 2.5, 3.5 or 4.5 will be considered 3, 4 or 5 respectively.

New Admissions will be subject to availability of seats in the respective colleges.

BACHELOR OF SCIENCE (B.Sc.)

A candidate who has passed one of the following examinations with pass in English as one of the subjects shall be eligible to join the First Semester class of **B.Sc. (General / B.Sc. Bio-Informatics and Honours)** Degree Course in a College affiliated to Panjab University. However, a candidate who has not qualified English as one of the subjects at the 10+2 examinations, shall be eligible to join B.Sc. 1st semester provisionally subject to his/her qualifying the deficient subject of English from the parent Board/ Body/Council/University in two consecutive chances subsequent to his/her admission, failing which his/her admission to B.Sc. 1st semester and the result for the examination shall automatically stand cancelled:-

- i. B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. Part-I (Old Scheme)/ Intermediate/ Arts/ Science/ Agriculture examination of Panjab University.
- ii. The +2 examination under 10+2+3 system of education of a recognized University /Board/Council.
- iii. Prak Shastri /Vishard examination with compulsory English (Vide Senate Para-LXXVII dated 06.12.2009)
- iv. Any other examination recognized by the University as equivalent to (i), (ii) and (iii) above.

Provided that:

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- i. A person joining B.Sc. course must have obtained at least 40% marks in aggregate in the qualifying examination.
- ii. A B.Sc. student must have out of the three elective subjects offered by him/her (excepting Anthropology), passed at least 2 Science subjects in the qualifying examination. He/she may offer the third elective subjects from the Faculty of Science or Faculty of Arts.

Provided further that a student shall be eligible to opt for the subject of

- i) Computer Science at the B.Sc. level if he/she has passed the10+2 examination with Science/Commerce/Economics/Mathematics and Computer related subjects like Computer/Information Technology etc. as one of the Elective/Optional subjects.
- ii) Biochemistry if he/she passed the 10+2 examination with the following subjects:(a) Physics (b) Chemistry (c) Mathematics/Biology
- iii) A student may opt for Computer Science in B.Sc. (General) (Non-Medical) as one of the elective subjects with the following combination (amended vide Syndicate Paragraph 32, dated 11.7.2005):
 - (a) Physics (b) Mathematics (c) Computer Science

NOTE: The candidates who have passed any computer related subject like Computer Science/Information Technology etc. as one of the Elective or Optional subjects at 10+2 level, be allowed to opt the subject of Computer Science at B.Sc. level w.e.f. the academic session 2012-13 (Syndicate Para 18 dated 27.09.2011).

A candidate who has been placed under compartment at 10+2 examination conducted by a Board/Body/Council/University in India shall be eligible to seek admission to the 1st Semester of B.Sc. course/s if he/she fulfils the following conditions:

- i. He/she should have been placed under compartment in one subject only;
- ii. He/she should have obtained at least 20% marks in the subject in which he has been placed in under compartment.
- iii. He/she should have obtained the required percentage of marks in the aggregate of the examination as laid down in the relevant regulations.

NOTE: Candidates securing less than 20% marks in the subject in which there is compartment at the 10+2 examination be made eligible to join B.Sc Part 1 course, if they clear or secure 20% or more marks in the subject in the Supplementary Examination held in July/August, on or before the last date for admission with late fee with the permission of the Vice-Chancellor, provided the seat/s is/are available (Syndicate para 43 (xiv) meeting held on 27-01-2013).

BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN BIOTECHNOLOGY (HONOURS)

Applicants seeking admission should have passed 10+2 examination (Medical/Non-Medical) examination of CBSE/ICSE or any other equivalent examination recognized by Panjab University. The candidate should have obtained at least 50% marks in aggregate at this level. However, admission will be on the basis of merit as per general rules of admission.

Note: For eligibility of all other B.Sc. courses (General, Elective, Honours and Vocational) please contact respective colleges.

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IMPORTANT POINTS

- a) OPEN SCHOOL 10+2 PASS CANDIDATE: A candidate who has been placed under compartment/re-appear in one subject only, with at least 20% marks (theory and practical taken together) in the subject in which he/she has been placed in compartment in 10 +2 examination, conducted by the Open School Board in India shall be eligible to seek admission to the 1st semester of B.A./B.Sc. (General) / B.Com. / B. / B.C.A. course under 10+2+3 system of education. He/she should have cleared the compartment before the declaration of the 2nd semester result. If he/she is unable to submit the relevant papers/ documents on the date of declaration of result then his/her admission will be automatically cancelled. (w.e.f the academic session 2009-2010) (amended vide Syndicate Para-16 dated 18.05.2014)
- b) A candidate who is admitted to the 1st/3rd/5th semester will be allowed to be promoted to 2nd/4th/6th semester respectively. However, for promotion from 2nd to 3rd or from 4th to 5th semester the candidate will have to clear 50% of the total papers till that semester. It is further clarified that for calculating 50%, fractions like 2.5, 3.5 or 4.5 will be considered 3, 4 or 5 respectively.
- c) The candidate who got admission in 1st semester in a college and after completing the 1st semester could not get the admission in 2nd Semester due to one or other reason, should be given admission in the 2nd semester next year with the condition that the candidate must have attended the classes / appeared in examinations in the college in 1st semester. To overcome this problem, few admission dates for 2nd semester should also be allotted in January i.e. one week after the Winter Break as per P.U. Academic Calendar, 2018-19. (As per Syndicate Para 49 Dated 01-05-2016).
- d) The Vice Chancellor has allowed to change a subject in any circumstances in the even semester examination whereas he/she will have to clear that subject as deficient in lower semesters examination which he/she has changed in the higher semester for qualifying the award of Bachelor's Degree (vide Circular No.Misc./A-6/3295 dated 06.04.2018).

Compulsory Subjects

1. English

2. **Punjabi/ History and Culture of Punjab:** Only the following students may take up History and Culture of Punjab in place of Punjabi Compulsory:

- a. Candidates who are not domicile of Punjab and have not studied Punjabi at Matriculation or +2 level either as an elective or additional (optional) subject (vide the Panjab University letter no. ST 9595, dated 3 October,2011) \
- b. Wards of Defence Personnel and Central Govt. Employees who are transferable on all-India basis.
- c. Foreigners

3. Environment, Road Safety Education, Violence against Women/ Children and Drug Abuse: It is a compulsory paper, which the candidates are required to pass with at least 33% marks either in Second, Fourth and Sixth Semester of the Course, failing which the Degree will not be issued.

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ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS FOR HONOURS

BACHELOR OF ARTS (HONOURS)

Honours courses in B.A. (3rd Semester)

- Students having secured at least 50% marks in the concerned elective subject in B.A. (1st & 2nd Semester) can opt for Honours Course in B.A. (3rd Semester).
- 2. Classes in Honours will commence only if the number of students opting for Honours in a particular subject is at least ten.

BACHELOR OF SCIENCE (HONOURS)

- 1. Students having secured at least 50% marks in the subject concerned in B.Sc. (General) Course first and 2nd semester opt for Honours in B.Sc. 3rd Semester.
- 2. Admissions will be strictly on merit basis subject to the availability of seats.

Eligibility Criteria for Bachelor of Science (General) 3rd and 5th semester

Any candidate who is admitted to the $1^{st}/3^{rd}/5^{th}$ semester will be allowed to be promoted to $2^{nd}/4^{th}/6^{th}$ semester respectively. However, for promotion from 2^{nd} to 3^{rd} or from 4^{th} to 5^{th} semester the candidate will have to clear 50% of the total papers till that semester. It is further clarified that for calculating 50%, fractions like 2.5, 3.5 or 4.5 will be considered 3, 4 or 5 respectively.

New Admissions will be subject to the availability of seats in the respective colleges.

Eligibility Criteria for Bachelor of Science in Biotechnology (Honours) 3rd and 5th semester

Any candidate who is admitted to the $1^{st}/3^{rd}/5^{th}$ semester will be allowed to be promoted to $2^{nd}/4^{th}/6^{th}$ semester respectively. However, for promotion from 2^{nd} to 3^{rd} or from 4^{th} to 5^{th} semester the candidate will have to clear 50% of the total papers till that semester. It is further clarified that for calculating 50%, fractions like 2.5, 3.5 or 4.5 will be considered 3, 4 or 5 respectively.

New Admissions will be subject to the availability of seats in the respective colleges.

Eligibility Conditions for Add-On Courses & Job Oriented Elective Subjects

Candidates are eligible to join these courses along with B.A. /B.Com. /B.Sc. /B.C.A. /B.B.A. 1st, 3rd and 5th semester depending on the availability of seats in the colleges where these courses are available. Students should regularly check the notice board of the respective college regarding the admission dates.

Certificate Courses

Candidates from all streams and classes, i.e. B.A. 1st, 3rd and 5th semester, B.Sc. 1st, 3rd and 5th semester, B.Com. 1st, 3rd and 5th semester & B.C.A. 1st, 3rd and 5th semester, P.G.D.C.A., M.A. & M.Sc. are eligible for admission to Add-on Certificate Courses.

Diploma Courses

Candidates who have passed certificate course will be eligible for admission to the respective Diploma Course.

Advance Diploma Courses

The candidates who have passed Diploma Course will be eligible for admission to the respective Advanced Diploma Course. Follow the Panjab University Calendar Volume-II, 2007 and also refer to the Website www.puchd.ac.in

Job Oriented Elective Subjects

- 1. Functional English: 10+2 (preference will be given to Course A students).
- **2.** Functional Hindi: Students should have studied Hindi as one of the subjects at +2 level.
- 3. Police Administration: Admission will be strictly based on merit.
- 4. Human Rights and Duties: Admission will be strictly based on merit.
- 5. Women Studies: Admission will be strictly based on merit.
- 6. Principles and Practices of Insurance: Admission will be strictly based on merit.

Important Note:

The Eligibility of courses is as per Panjab University Regulations. Any Change in Eligibility Condition by the Panjab University will be applicable.

Reservation Policy

Reservation of seats in different categories viz, Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Dependents of Defence and Paramilitary Personnel, Freedom Fighters, Physically Challenged and Sports will be made in accordance with the rules and instructions framed by the Chandigarh Administration, whereas in case of Single Girl Child, One out of Two Girl Children, Kashmiri Migrants, Kargil Martyrs, Cancer/AIDS/Thalassemia, students from Jammu & Kashmir, Border Area, Rural Area will be made as per instructions issued by Panjab University from time to time.

In making admissions;

- 1. All the affiliated colleges of Chandigarh (U.T.) shall follow the reservation policy of Union Territory Administration.
- 2. All affiliated colleges of Punjab State shall follow the reservation policy of the Punjab Government.

Any student who applies in more than one reserved category will be considered in each reserved category in which he/she applies for admission, maintaining his/her internal seniority in each reserved category on the basis of merit in that category. In such a case, the student will get the benefit in one category of his/her choice.

As per letter no. 19/1/93/IH (3) 5311 dated 18th March, 1999 from Home Secretary, Chandigarh Administration, the following policy shall be followed w.r.t reservation of seats:

In continuation of this Administration's circular letter no. 19/1/93/IH(3-99/11136) dated 9th June, 1999 on the above subject, which inter alia provides that 85% seats of the total sanctioned intake of an institution will be filled up from amongst the students who pass their qualifying examination from schools/colleges recognized by the Chandigarh Administration and situated in the Union Territory, Chandigarh, as regular students of the said school/college, which will be termed as UT POOL. The remaining 15% seats will be filled from amongst students, who pass their qualifying examinations from institutions other than those located in the Union Territory, Chandigarh or otherwise, which will be termed as GENERAL POOL.

Note:

- i. **UT Pool Candidates:** Those who have passed lower qualifying examination as regular candidates from schools and colleges in UT, Chandigarh.
- ii. **General Pool Candidates:** Those who have passed lower qualifying examination from schools and colleges outside UT, Chandigarh.

A. Reservation of Seats (for all classes except B.P.Ed. - Four Year Course)

The reservation is out of 85% seats of UT Pool and 15% seats of General Pool.

Note: Amendment, if any, in the reservation policy of Chandigarh Administration/Panjab University will be followed up to the date of admission for each course.

*According to the letter vide Home Department, Chandigarh Administration order no. 19/1/3-IH(3)-2008/20352 dated 27/10/2008, endorsed by DHE vide no. 2778-dhe-ut-c5-26(i)92-II dated 6/11/ 2008, it has been decided to consider the wards of serving defence personnel/ex-servicemen i.e. sons/daughters, under 85% quota only for calculation of seats.

** The rights of persons with Disabilities Act, 2016

All government institutions of higher education and other higher education institutions receiving aid from the government shall reserve not less than 5% seats for persons with benchmark disabilities.

B. Reservation for the Dependents of Defence/Para-Military Personnel etc. is on the following priority:

- i. Sons/daughters/spouses of Defence Personnel who are awardees of gallantry decorations of ParamVir/MahaVir/Vir Chakra in person or posthumously.
- ii. Sons/daughters/spouses of Defence Personnel/Para-Military Personnel like CRPF and BSF who were killed or are totally incapacitated in action while in service and are wholly dependent on them.
- iii. Sons/daughters/spouses of ex- servicemen (Defence/Para-Military Personnel) who are wholly dependent on them.
- iv. Sons/daughters/spouses of serving persons (Defence/Para-Military Personnel) who are wholly dependent on them.

Refer to Panjab University letter no. 7751-7780/Misc. /A-6, dated 14-8-2003. Policy regarding reservation of seats in admission to educational/technical/medical institutions under the control of Chandigarh Administration - amendment thereof: "For the purpose of reservation to the category Para-Military Forces, wherever applicable, this category shall include wards of personnel serving in the Intelligence Bureau, National Security Guards, and Special Services Bureau at par with the wards of employees of other Para-Military Forces, in consonance with the circular issued by Government of India, Ministry of Home Affairs, no. 27011/9/98- PF-I dated 26-5-1998."

C. Reservation for Physically Challenged

The physically challenged student will be required to furnish a medical certificate issued by the Principal Medical Officer of his concerned district/Civil Surgeon of Chandigarh, indicating percentage of disability, whether he/she is otherwise able to pursue his / her studies, name

of the disease/handicap, whether the handicap is temporary or permanent; and whether the handicap is progressively degenerative.

5% marks concession will be given to physically handicapped persons in the minimum eligibility criteria for a course subject to minimum disability of 40%, provided they have obtained minimum pass marks prescribed by regulations.

(Amendment in PU calendar Vol I 2007 chapter VIII (D) Regulation 29.3 approved by Senate PU on 29-03-2008)

Students with a temporary handicap will not be considered against the reserved seats for the physically challenged. Where the certificate is issued by any authority other than the Principal Medical Officer of Chandigarh, the concerned Head of the institution shall refer the candidate to the Principal Medical Officer, Chandigarh and shall admit the candidate only after confirmation from the PMO, Chandigarh.

All candidates seeking admission, except in the case of Chandigarh Medical College and Punjab Engineering College (where the existing practice shall continue), will furnish an undertaking, as under, along with their application form:

I certify that I have no such physical handicap/disability which would hinder the pursuit of studies in the course in which I am seeking admission. If at a later stage it is found that I have a physical handicap/disability which hinders the pursuit of studies in the course in which I am seeking admission, then my admission will be liable to be cancelled.

In case of any doubt in interpretation of any clause of these instructions, the matter shall be referred to the Chandigarh Administration whose decision shall be final.

D. Reservation for Wards of Freedom Fighters

2% seats in each pool will be filled from the category of children and grandchildren of Freedom Fighters. A certificate issued by the Deputy Commissioner of the concerned district will have to be attached with the admission form.

E. Concession to the Wards of Kashmiri Migrants / Displaced Persons

As per letter No. Misc./A-6/84247-84447 dated 10.05.2017 from the Deputy Registrar, Panjab University: As conveyed vide letter no. D.O No. F 1-13/2010 CPP-II dated 19th March 2015 from University Grants Commission and letter No. F. No. 3-1/2012-NER dated 12th March 2015 from Govt. of India, Ministry of Human Resource Development, Department of Higher Education, Shastri Bhawan, New Delhi with regard to the concession to the Kashmiri migrant for admission in Higher Education which are read as under

- i. Relaxation in cut-off percentage up to 10% subject to minimum eligibility requirement.
- ii. Increase in intake capacity upto 5% course wise
- iii. Reservation of at least 1 seat in merit quota in technical/professional institutions
- iv. Waiving off domicile requirements.

F. Concession to the Wards of Permanently Disabled and Martyrs of Kargil War

- a) Reservation of 1% seats with minimum of 1 seat in the Departments and affiliated colleges except in partially financed/self-financing courses.
- b) Exemption of Fee.
- c) Exemption of Hostel Fee. (vide Syndicate Para 30 (XI) dated 29-)7-08. for the direct descendants of the Kargil Martyrs/permanently disabled (up to 80% leading to

incapacitation) as per letter no. 6576-6875/R & S, dated 27-05-2014 received from the Panjab University.

G. Reservation for Single Girl Child/One Girl Child out of the only Two Girl Children

As per decision of Panjab University contained in Letter No. Misc./A-6/2404 dated:14/03/2018 from The Deputy Registrar (colleges) Panjab University Chandigarh.

- 1. Two additional seats per unit per course subject to maximum limit of four (4) out of the two girl children from the session 2015-16 are created for admission to a given course in Panjab University Teaching Departments, Regional Centers and its affiliated Colleges, provided they are otherwise eligible. The Additional seats will be only for those girl children who are either a single girl child or one amongst the only two girl children with no male child. The additional seat will be available to only one of the two girl children of a couple.
- 2. An affidavit on a stamp paper worth Rs. 20/- duly attested by Class I Magistrate to be obtained from the parents of the girl children declaring therein that the benefit of this scheme is being claimed for only one girl child out of the two girl children and the parents shall not claim the same for the 2nd girl child elsewhere in future.

(The Specimen of the affidavit is given at the end of the Prospectus)

H. Cancer / AIDS / Thalassemia patients

- One additional seat each for the student suffering from Cancer/AIDS/Thalassemia has been allowed for admission in each course in Panjab University Teaching Departments, Regional Centres and its affiliated colleges, subject to the condition that the candidate seeking admission under each of these categories is otherwise eligible.
- 2. The claimant candidate will have to submit a certificate as a proof from the National Medical Institute like PGI, AIIMS etc. in support of his/her claims.

NOTE: The benefit of additional seats under the aforesaid categories will not be admissible to the students seeking admission in the courses falling under regulatory agencies such as MCI, DCI, BCI and NCTE.

I. Students from Jammu & Kashmir

As per the letter No. F.I-1/2012(SA-III) dated 13.03.2015, the Syndicate has allowed to create 2 seats under supernumerary quota in all recognized Higher Education Institutions for students from Jammu & Kashmir.

J. Border Area Students

As per the letter No. Misc./A-6/83946-84246 dated 03.05.2017 from The Deputy Registrar (Colleges) Panjab University Chandigarh, **one additional seat over and above the sanctioned seats** has been reserved for border area students. The Border Area students shall mean those candidates who have passed their matriculation and 10+2 examination from the Border Area Schools situated within 20 kms from the International Border. A candidate claiming such benefit will have to produce a certificate from the Tehsildar or the Principal/Headmaster/Head of the School certifying that the Schools from where the candidate has passed the matriculation or 10+2 examination, falls within the aforesaid

Border Area.

K. Rural Area Students

As per the letter No. Misc./A-6/83946-84246 dated 03.05.2017 from The Deputy Registrar (Colleges) Panjab University, Chandigarh two additional seats for only those candidates will be considered in this category, who have passed their Matriculation and 10+2 Examination from those rural schools that do not fall in the area of Municipal Corporation/Municipal Committee/Small Town/Notified Area. Further, the candidates should have been studying in such school for at least 5 years before passing the last examination. A candidate claiming such benefit will have to produce a certificate from the D.E.O./Principal of the concerned institute of the area certifying that the school from where the candidate has passed the Matriculation and 10+2 examinations, falls within the aforesaid Rural Area.

L. Weightage for excellence in Youth Festival

- As per letter no PU/DYW/1010-1200 Dated 27.05.2016, approved by syndicate, in all the teaching courses (except the courses governed by AICTE/NCTE/BCI/MCI/DCI etc.) being run in Panjab University Campus including Constituent Colleges/Regional Centres/ Affiliated Colleges, one additional seat per unit will be reserved for those candidates who have excelled and outperformed in the Youth Festivals.
- 2. The candidates availing the aforesaid weightage must fulfill the eligibility condition for admission to the particular course. For those courses to which admission is to be done on the basis of entrance test, the candidate must have passed the entrance test. The selection of such candidates for admission to various courses at PU Campus/Regional Centres/ Constituent Colleges/Affiliated Colleges will be made by the respective admission committees.
- 3. For recommending admission on the basis of youth festival participation, admission criterion will be fixed on the basis of merit as mentioned below and upon the verification of the original certificates of those candidates, who:
 - a. have presented an item in an international cultural festival approved by Punjab Govt. /Govt. of India /Panjab University.
 - b. have got distinction in All India National Inter University Youth Festival organized by AIU/Govt. of India.
 - c. have got distinction in North Zone Inter University Youth Festival organized by AIU.
 - d. have secured First/Second/Third position in Inter University Youth Festival organized by Govt. of Punjab / any State or Central University.
 - e. have secured First/Second/Third position in Panjab University Inter Zonal Festival.
 - f. have secured First/Second/Third position in Panjab University Zonal Festival.
 - g. have secured First/Second/Third position in state level competition of State School Education Board of Punjab/Haryana/HP/or CBSE/ICSE or any other recognized board.
 - ✓ Category A is considered as higher category followed by B, C onwards.
 - ✓ Preference will be given to the candidate/s who have represented Panjab University, Chandigarh in A, B, C or D category.
 - ✓ In case of two or more candidate having equal position at equal level:
 - a. Position secured in an individual item shall be rated higher than position secured as a team member.
 - b. The eligibility of the candidate for participation in University Youth Festivals, in future, may also be considered.

- c. Academic record will be considered in case of tie between two or more candidates.
- 4. In case of any ambiguity, the related certificates shall be verified from the Department of Youth Welfare, Panjab University through the concerned Chairperson/Principal/Head etc.
- 5. The candidate/s admitted on the basis of Youth Festival additional quota seats shall have to give an assurance to the university authorities that during the duration of the course the candidate will participate in the activities associated with his/her item and will not create any kind of indiscipline. The admission committee will assess the participation of the candidate and in case the candidate does not fulfill the requirements, his admission may be cancelled. However, exemption may be given because of special reasons like sickness or any other unavoidable reason.

M. Weightage for Participation in Cultural Activities

As per letter no. 49411-49601 dated 25-06-2014 from the Deputy Registrar Panjab University Chandigarh, the Syndicate at its meeting held on 26-4-2014 vide paragraph 41 has approved the criteria to give weightage to Cultural Activities for admission to various University courses.

1. National Cadet Corps (NCC)

The holders of NCC - A, B and C Certificates shall be given weightage in marks as under:A: 1%B: 2%C: 3%

2. National Service Scheme (NSS)

As per decision of the Syndicate Para (13) meeting dated 22.11.2014 and Syndicate Para (36) dated 25-01-2015, regarding accreditation 'A, B & C' certificate & weightage 1%, 2% & 3% for NSS volunteers.

A candidate can claim weightage in one or more categories given above. However, the total weightage allowed shall not exceed 9% of the normalized marks obtained in the qualifying examination. These weightages shall not be used for determining eligibility for admission as prescribed by the Panjab University under its regulations.

Note:

- 1. The student/s belonging to the above categories will also be considered in the general category according to his/her merit. If admitted on the basis of his/her merit in the general category, he/she will not be counted towards the seats reserved for the categories concerned.
- 2. Rules of Reservation policy existing at the time of admission will be applicable.

N. Reserved Categories of Sports

This will be as per rules and regulations of Sports Dept. of the Chandigarh Administration vide Home Secretary letter no. 8493, dated 5-5-2003 (endorsed vide letter no. 2081 dated 06.04.2018 from the sports department, Chandigarh Administration). Implementation of the policy will be as under:

- 1. 2% of the total number of seats in each course shall be filled up by sportsmen/ sportswomen. These 2% seats shall be reserved in each branch of Engineering/Non-Engineering courses in the institutions on the basis of total intake of each branch. Fraction of 0.5 or above shall be rounded off to the next higher number. This category shall not be divided into UT pool/General pool. The inter merit of the candidates seeking admission in any course in the Reserved Category of sports shall be determined only on the basis of their merit in sports as per grading criteria mentioned. In case any of the seats in the sports category in any branch remains vacant, the same shall be thrown open to the candidates of General Category. This policy is for the players of Chandigarh only.
- 2. Benefit of reservation under this category shall be available only to the following category of students:
 - i. Those who pass their qualifying examination from Schools/Colleges, recognized by the Chandigarh Administration in the Union Territory of Chandigarh as regular students for at least two years before applying for Gradation Certificate will be given admission subject to the condition that such students must represent Chandigarh State/Schools etc. in the National / other recognized tournaments.
 - ii. Where the Chandigarh Administration has adopted the notification of other States/U.Ts. on reciprocal basis, to give benefit of reservation to admission in sports category in Chandigarh, they will be graded as per the existing policy of the Chandigarh Administration.
 - iii. Countersigning of the Gradation Certificates shall only be admissible on reciprocal basis provided that countersigned certificates will be graded as per the policy of the Chandigarh Administration.

- 3. Students seeking admission under this category shall be considered only:
 - i. If his/her age falls within the age group which is eligible for participation in Inter-College/Inter-University tournaments.
 - ii. If his/her achievement in sports relates to his/her activity in any of the three years preceding the year of admission. (For example, for admission in the year 2011-12, the Achievements shall not be prior to April, 2008).
 - iii. Gradation Certificate will not be meant for employment purposes.
- 4. The Director Sports, Chandigarh Administration, or his nominee, not below the rank of the Joint Director, Sports will issue the certificate, and also have the authority to cancel any certificate at any time if it is found to have been issued on false/incorrect/concealed information or record.

Note: The merit of certificates shall be graded as A, B, C, D in the descending order. Details of these grades are available with the admission committees of all the colleges.

O. Reservation for victims of November 1984 riots and terrorism

As per the letter no. Misc/A-6/85581-85781 dated 25/5/17 received from Deputy Registrar, Panjab University, Chandigarh, 2% reservation is for sons/daughters/husband/wife/brothers/sisters of persons killed/incapacitated in terrorist violence in Punjab and Chandigarh. A certificate from the District Magistrate to this effect must be submitted by the candidate. Migration card alone is not enough.

Note: Amendment if any in the reservation policy of Chandigarh Administration/Panjab University will be followed.

Guidelines & Instructions Pertaining to Academics

CHANGE OF SUBJECT B.A. /B.Sc. 1st SEMESTER

Candidates seeking admission to B.A. (1st Semester) are advised to select subjects carefully after due consideration. Change of subjects will be allowed in B.A. /B.Sc. (1st Semester) only **once** and that too depending on the availability of seats in that particular subject. This option can be exercised by the students of B.A./B.Sc. (1st Semester) within the stipulated time decided by the respective college after the commencement of the academic session. Applications on the prescribed form for subject change must be routed through the concerned teachers and the Incharge, Change of Subjects.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA TO APPEAR IN UNIVERSITY EXAMINATIONS

Attendance Requirement

As per the University Regulations, a student is required to attend at least:

- 1. **75%** of the lectures delivered to his/her class in theory as well as practical subject opted by him/her.
- 2. **75%** of the tutorials/practicals for B.Com. classes in each of the subject offered by him/her.

HOUSE EXAMINATIONS & INTERNAL ASSESSMENT FOR DEGREE CLASSES

As per the instructions of Panjab University, Chandigarh, Internal Assessment is based on the result of mid-term exams conducted by the college in each paper of all the subjects as well extracurricular activity and attendance (75% minimum).

Absence or exemption from the examination on any ground (even medical) is treated as failure with nil marks.

A student attending NCC Camps/Sports/Cultural Activities will seek prior permission for remaining absent in mid-term exams. He/she may be allowed to appear in a Special Test, if held at the discretion of the Principal.

Note: A student is required to obtain a minimum of 25% marks in aggregate of all subjects in the House Examinations to be eligible for the University examination.

LEAVE RULES

- 1. Prior sanction of leave must be taken by the students before they proceed on leave.
- 2. Students should apply for leave on the leave application form available in the college office.
- 3. In case of sickness or an emergency, the leave application must be submitted within a week.
- 4. Application for sick leave for more than five days will have to be supported by a Medical Certificate from a Government Dispensary/Hospital.

- 5. Leave on medical grounds or otherwise does not entitle a student to claim benefit of lectures or for appearing in the Special Test.
- 6. Absence fine without leave is Re. 1/- per period.

LIBRARY RULES

All the five Government Colleges and Regional Institute of English have well stocked libraries with open shelf system. Latest books, journals, periodicals and newspapers are accessible to the students. Computers with high speed internet/ wi-fi/ LAN connectivity have been installed to facilitate the students. Besides, educational material is also available in the form of CDs and Audio Cassettes

As soon as a student is admitted to the college, he/she shall be issued an Identity Card and Library Card-cum-Reader's Ticket on production of the fee receipt. Four stamp size photographs are to be fixed, one each on the Identity Card and Membership card, and two on Reader's Tickets. Every student shall keep his/her Identity Card on his/her person during his/her stay in the college. A student who fails to produce the Identity Card/Library card on demand may be refused entry in the classes/library and or may become liable to disciplinary action.

Book Bank

Under the scheme of University Grants Commission for Text Book Library, complete sets of Text Books are issued to the needy students for the entire session.

Issue of Books

- i. Books shall be issued for 14 days.
- ii. Overdue fine @Rs. 1/- per book per day shall be charged.

Library Security

- 1. Refund/lapse of Security of students leaving college: All outgoing students must submit Library Security Refund Form (available in the Office) to the dealing assistant of the office.
- 2. For students leaving college mid-session: Application for refund of security must be made on the prescribed form immediately on leaving the college.

Note: Security will lapse if not claimed within one year of leaving the college.

AWARD FOR ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE

PRIZES

To encourage better performance in academics, prizes are awarded to the students on the basis of their results in the House Examinations, subject to the following rules:

- 1. A student failing in the House Examinations or seeking exemption on any ground, whatsoever, will not be eligible for the prize.
- 2. University prizes will be awarded strictly according to the position held by the students in the University Examinations and notified in the Panjab University Gazette.
- 3. Special examinations, if held, will determine only the eligibility of the students for the University Examination and will not be considered for the academic prizes. However, if a student misses an examination in one or more subjects due to participation in

National/University competitions but secures a First/Second/Third position in the subject he/she has appeared for, he/she will be entitled to that prize.

4. Special prizes and certificates are awarded for distinction in co-curricular activities.

Roll of Honour

Roll of Honour is awarded to outstanding students for distinction in academics / co-curricular activities/sports.

The record is maintained in the Roll of Honour Register.

College Colours and Merit Certificates

Academic Prizes, College Colours and Merit Certificates are awarded to the students for their outstanding achievements in academics, sports and other co-curricular activities as per rules laid down by the college.

CONCESSIONS & SCHOLARSHIPS

Various concessions and scholarships are as under:

- 1. **General Students:** Concession in Fee; (Refer to Common Fee Concession Application Form given in the Prospectus). Half Tuition Fee concession is given to 10% of admitted students whose family income from all sources per annum is upto Rs. 1 Lakh.
- 2. Half Fee Brother/Sister Concession : A student whose elder brother/sister is paying full fee in any of the Govt. Colleges of Chandigarh Administration, should apply for concession within 30 days after getting admission in their respective college/same college.
- 3. Blind Students' Concession: All blind candidates shall be exempted from payment of tuition fees and admission fees in all the classes. (As per university letter no 72667-72867/1dated 20-10-2015 from Panjab University) Free education will be imparted to the completely blind student belonging to Below Poverty Line as described by the relevant government notification/s, in any course of the University affiliated colleges, subject to the students being otherwise eligible and on merit. The candidate however has to submit an affidavit to this effect issued by the competent authority.

Free hostel accommodation may also be considered, if required by the students, but he/she will have to pay the mess charges which are already subsidized.

A limited number of course books (one paper) may also be considered which would be returnable after the completion of course. (Syndicate para 1 dated 18.04.2009)

A "**Writer**" for the blind students on payment @ Rs 300/-per paper, subject to the upper limit of Rs 2000/-per University Semester Examination is provided by the respective government college out of PLA funds for their convenience. (As per DHE letter Memo. No. DHE-UT-C6-12(3)17 dated 25-04-2017)

- 4. Concession to Children of persons killed in November 1984 riots and terrorist violence in Punjab State: Free education is imparted to children of persons belonging to the above mentioned category. (Approved vide Syndicate para 5 (Statement A)) Dated 25-04-1987 vide letter no 6576- 6875/R&S dated 27-05- 2014 from Panjab University.
- 5. **All SC/ST Students:** All SC/ST students are eligible for free books and stationery. Administration provides free books and stationery to each SC/ST student.
- 6. Non Hindi Speaking Scholarships: To encourage the study of Hindi in Non-Hindi

speaking States and to make available to the Governments of these States, suitable personnel for teaching and other posts where knowledge of Hindi is essential, scholarships are sanctioned under the Government of India scheme to students from Non-Hindi speaking States for Post-Matric Studies in Hindi. Five scholarships given by the Chandigarh Administration are as follows: Rs 500/- per month for B.A. /B.Sc./B.Com. (Pass & Honours) I, II, III and Rs 1000/- per month for M.A. I, II.

- 7. Meritorious Students Scholarship under the Government of India National Scholarship Scheme and UT State Merit Scholarship Scheme: Meritorious students are given scholarship @ Rs. 100 per month, of which 86 scholarships are given under the Government National Scholarship Scheme and 21 scholarships are given under the UT Merit Scholarship Scheme.
- 8. **Economically Weak Students:** If the income of their parents is less than Rs.1 Lakh per annum, students are given financial aid out of Students' Aid Fund & Red Cross Fund.

Note: These concessions are not applicable to self-financing courses.

Other Scholarships/Stipends

The cases of all eligible students are recommended for grant of the following scholarships/stipends/awards:

- 1. Indian Council for Cultural Relations Scholarship
- 2. Post-Matric Scholarship for SC/ST, Minority Communities, Backward Class, students with disabilities and transgenders.
- 3. Scholarship to the Disabled Students pursuing studies from Class IX onwards
- 4. Handicapped Students' Scholarship
- 5. Award of Scholarship out of PU Students Relief Fund
- Sanskrit Scholarships: Meritorious students who had taken up Sanskrit in 10+2 exam and opt for Sanskrit as an elective subject in B.A. I are eligible to apply for Sanskrit Scholarships in B.A. I, II & III of Rs.4000/- per annum on the recommendation of Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, New Delhi
- 7. Award of PU Sports Stipend
- 8. Sports Talent Scholarship from Chandigarh Administration.
- 9. Scholarship may also be given to students whose earning parent dies and the family income falls within the prescribed income limit as given in the centrally sponsored scheme of Post-Matric Scholarship for SC/ST students.
- 10. Award of Chandigarh (UT) Government. Merit Scholarship (Eligibility to be determined on the basis of result of B.A. /B.Sc. Final Examination)
- 11. Following two scholarships are offered only to students who are domicile of Punjab
 - a) National Merit Scholarship DPI (C) Punjab
 - b) State merit Scholarship DPI (C) Punjab
- 12. Post-Matric Studies in Hindi DHE, Chandigarh Administration
- 13. Students' Aid Fund
- 14. Other Scholarships as Means Cum Merit, Sports, Single Girl Child, Physically Disabled, AIDS/Cancer Patient are being awarded by College Development Council, Panjab University Chandigarh.

- 8. **No Responsibility of any loss**: Students are advised not to bring heavy cash, jewellery or any other expensive items to college as the college authorities will not be responsible for any loss.
