Chief Guest



Shri Manish Tewari is a distinguished Member of Parliament representing the Chandigarh Constituency (Union Territory) in the Lok Sabha. He is currently serving his third term in Parliament. Previously, he served as the Union Minister of Information and Broadcasting in the Government of India.

Shri Tewari is an active participant in parliamentary committees. He currently serves on the Standing Committee of Finance, the Joint Committee on the Constitution (One Hundred and Twenty-Ninth Amendment) Bill, 2024, and the Union Territories Laws (Amendment) Bill, 2024. He is also a member of the Consultative Committee for the Ministry of External Affairs. In his previous term, he contributed to the Parliamentary Standing Committee of Finance and the Parliamentary Consultative Committee for Defense. Additionally, he was involved in the Joint Committee of Parliament that conceptualized the Law on Data Protection and examined the Multi-State Cooperative Societies (Amendment Bill) of 2022.

A legal expert, Shri Tewari practices law at the Supreme Court of India and various High Courts across the country. He is an international arbitrator with a specialization in both traditional and emerging areas of law, particularly in the new economy.

Shri Tewari was elected to the Lok Sabha from Ludhiana, Punjab, from 2009 to 2014, and from Sri Anandpur Sahib, Punjab, from 2019 to 2024. Between 2016 and 2019, he served as a Distinguished Senior Fellow at the Atlantic Council in Washington, D.C. He is also the Senior National Spokesperson for the Indian National Congress (INC), General Secretary for the Foreign Affairs Department of INC, and a Permanent Invitee to the Congress Working Committee (CWC).

A prolific writer, Shri Tewari has authored four books, with his latest work, 10 Flash Points: 20 Years of National Security Situations that Impacted India, becoming a bestseller in its genre. He has also introduced multiple bills in Parliament, advocating for legal frameworks and parliamentary oversight over India's intelligence agencies and national security structures, particularly in the emerging fields of cyber security, space exploration, and artificial intelligence.

In 2024, she earned a bronze medal at the 4th Hockey India Senior Women Department National Championship, further affirming her ability to compete at the highest levels. Between 2020 and 2023, she consistently represented her team in various editions of the Hockey India Senior Women National Championships, where her contributions were integral to her team's overall performance. Her sustained success at the senior level speaks volumes about her skill, resilience, and adaptability to the demands of competitive hockey.

In addition to her accomplishments in the senior national circuit, Ms Kaur's versatility was further demonstrated through her participation in both the Hockey India Junior National Championship and the 5-A-Side Senior National Championship, where she earned impressive rankings. These achievements reflect not only her technical and tactical flexibility but also her commitment to excelling in different formats of the game. Ms Rashanpreet Kaur's journey in hockey is a testament to her relentless work ethic, exceptional talent, and dedication to advancing the profile of Indian women's hockey. Her continued success serves as an inspiration to young athletes, positioning her as an influential figure in the development and promotion of the sport in India.

Academic Courses

Affiliated to Panjab University, Chandigarh, the College offers Post Graduate Courses in Commerce, Economics and English; Undergraduate Courses in Commerce, Sciences (Non-Med and Comp Sc), Computer Science & Applications and Humanities. A total number of 1411 students were enrolled in the current session for different programmes of study.

Infrastructure

The sprawling 11-acre campus is replete with an expanse of infrastructure which includes the latest facilities with three- storeyed Arts, Science and Commerce Blocks with spacious, well-equipped classrooms and smart classrooms. A ramp connects all blocks to the ground floor offering easy access to the physically challenged.

The College has well-equipped laboratories in the Departments of Physics, Chemistry, Computer Science, Functional English, Psychology, Home Science, Music, and Fine Arts. The College library is spacious, fully automated with Campus Whizz ERP software, centrally air-conditioned, equipped with INFLIBNET database. The Learning Resource Centre facilitates the students in their research-oriented activities. The library also has a Braille Corner with NVDA (Non-Visual Digital Access) software for visually challenged students.

The College houses a **Research Lab**, an air- conditioned **Seminar Room**, and **Mata Ganga Auditorium**. The College boasts a large sports ground with a multipurpose track, **Mata Gujri Fitness Centre**, an open air gym and expansive grounds for students. The **Students' Centre** is housed with Canteen- cum-Cafeteria, a Stationery Shop along with Photostat Facility. Also located in the College is a fully functional SBI Branch exclusively for the benefit of students and College employees. The College takes pride in its landscape gardens set near the main building with smooth lawns and beds of perennials which augment the beauty of the campus. The College has **Campus-wide Wi-Fi Facility**, **24x7 CCTV Surveillance** and 24x7 Power Supply and Generator Facility.

The College campus won the First prize in the 'Best Maintained Campus' at the 53rd Chandigarh Rose Festival 2025, organised by Municipal Corporation, Chandigarh Administration from February 21-23, 2025.




College Library

The College remains committed to delivering quality education while continuously enhancing its infrastructure to support effective teaching and learning. A cornerstone of this commitment is the modernised library, efficiently managed by Ms Sukhdeep Kaur, the Librarian with her dedicated team Mr Jaspreet Singh, Library Assistant, and Ms Gagandeep Kaur, Library Restorer.

The College Library maintains a blog (ggscwlibrary.blogspot.in), providing students with access to a range of resources, including previous years' question papers, newspaper clippings, the latest Panjab University syllabus, and links to various open-access e-resources. Operating under an Open Access system, the Library encourages students to explore and expand their knowledge. Its extensive collection includes over 24,560 books and 490+ CDs across diverse subjects, including reference books, coffee table books, and leisure reading materials such as fiction, self-help, and biographies. Additionally, the Library subscribes to nine magazines, two journals, and six newspapers annually. The Book Bank, housing over 2,000 books across various disciplines, supports both high-achieving and needy students by lending books for the entire academic session. New arrivals are showcased on a designated display stand, complemented by an LEDTV highlighting Library services, notices and recent acquisitions.

The Library is integrated with **Campus Whizz ERP software**, ensuring efficient resource management. A standout feature is the Learning Resource Centre, located on the first floor, offering enhanced facilities for research-oriented activities. Furthermore, the Library is inclusive, accommodating a **Braille Corner** equipped with a computer installed with **NVDA** (**Non-Visual Digital Access**) software for visually impaired students. To expand digital access, the College subscribes to e-books and e-journals via the NLIST program of INFLIBNET, UGC.

A dedicated reading room provides students with a quiet space for personal study. Additionally, every academic year, newly enrolled students participate in an orientation program, familiarizing them with the Library's services and resources, ensuring they can fully utilize its offerings.





Mata Kheevi Hostel

The College has a well-equipped Hostel offering accommodation to 300 residents and catering to four SES institutions. There is a Gurudwara Sahib within the Hostel premises, which offers sanctum to students. Periodic renovation of the Hostel is undertaken to ensure comfort and hygiene levels to the residents. Facilities like Reading Room, Common Room, Visitors' Room and LCDs are provided.

Scholarships and Concessions

The students of the College are constantly motivated for attaining excellence in the University Examinations through various incentive schemes such as scholarships, fee concessions, Roll of Honour and prizes. In this session, too, sports students were given huge concessions. A sum of 19,09,238/- was given as College fee concession and 16.4 lakhs were given as Hostel Fee concession.





POSTGRADUATE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE

The Department has been actively engaged in organizing various programs and workshops aimed at enhancing students' practical knowledge, skill development, and employability. The department collaborated with leading industry experts and organisations to provide valuable learning opportunities beyond the classroom. Below is an overview of the activities conducted during the academic session:

The program was conducted with industry experts delivering sessions with the objective of providing practical insights into the fields of banking, insurance, and finance, bridging the gap between academic learning and industry requirements.

The seminar, led by their esteemed speaker, Mr Rajeev Markanday, was attended by 95 enthusiastic students, eager to explore the various career opportunities that await them after graduation. While highlighting the theme, the speaker described the key attributes such as confidence, listening skills, observation skills, group discussions, verbal and non-verbal communication with relevant examples.



A workshop was conducted on the **Prime Minister's Employment Generation Programme** (PMEGP) on January 28, 2025. The workshop encouraged students to explore self-employment as a viable career option.

POST GRADUATE DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH

The department hosted **Bridge Course: A Lecture Series on Literary Periods and Theories of English Literature,** running from September 26, 2024 to October 21, 2024. The course covered the evolution of English literature from the Anglo-Saxon era to Postmodernism.



The Department organised 'Bridging Worlds: Celebrating Translation' on September 30, 2024 in observance of World Translation Day. The event was designed to highlight the importance of translation in today's interconnected world and to celebrate the rich cultural and linguistic diversity that translation brings together. Students actively participated in this engaging program, which focused on the pivotal role of translation in literature. Two key activities formed the core of the event: the first was the translation of a Hindi or Punjabi poem into English. Participants were provided with poems in vernacular languages and tasked with translating them into English within a 30- minute timeframe. The second activity was a lively quiz, where students translated the titles of books, movies, and common idioms and phrases between the vernacular and English languages.



In association with NCC Naval Wing, the department organised a Slogan and Creative Writing Competition on the occasion of Gandhi Jayanti on October 01, 2024. The topic for the slogan writing competition was 'Swabhav Swachhata, Sanskar Swachhata', while the topic for creative writing competition was to write a letter to

Mahatma Gandhi sharing with him the current state of our nation and the world. 30 students participated in each event with Bhumi Kashyap winning the First Prize in slogan writing competition followed by Gunjan and Simarpreet winning the Second and Third Prizes, respectively. In the creative writing competition, Sonali Sood of MA II English won the First Prize and Blessy and Mehak were adjudged for Second and Third Prize, respectively.

On October 18, 2024, an **Educational Tour to the Khushwant Singh Literary Festival** in Kasauli was organised by the department. The students attended three key sessions in detail. Historian William Dalrymple's 'Past Perfect' delved into India's rich historical narratives and the impact of colonialism, offering students invaluable insights into historical storytelling. Following this, a mesmerizing performance by violinist L. Subramaniam in 'Golden Melodies: Bringing the East to the West' captivated the audience, blending Indian and Western musical traditions. Additionally, Major General Ian Cardozo's session 'Courage Under Fire' moved the audience with tales of bravery and valour, emphasizing the importance of resilience in the face of adversity.



While these sessions were their primary focus, students also briefly attended other discussions, including Prahlad Kakkar's 'The Zing Thing' and a thought-provoking panel on 'The Future of Politics' featuring Manish Tewari and Prem Shankar Jha. The trip provided a rich educational experience, broadening their understanding of historical, cultural, and political narratives in today's world.

A 3-hour **Workshop on Research Methodology**, for the students of postgraduate and undergraduate honours courses, was conducted on November 12, 2024. The workshop familiarised the students with the philosophies of methodology like phenomenology, ethnography, simulations, action research and grounded theory. The workshop also highlighted the difference between qualitative and quantitative research methods and the key characteristics involved in both. The workshop rounded off with a discussion on the different tools and styles of citation including MLA 8th edition, and APA 7th edition. Stress was also laid on the need of academic writing in research.

The Department conducted a **30-Hour Value Added Certificate Course titled 'Fundamentals of Fluent English' from February 04, 2025 to April 07, 2025.** The course aimed to enhance students' proficiency in English by covering a range of topics, from fundamental grammar and linguistics to public speaking. Designed to strengthen both written and verbal communication skills, the course provided students with a structured approach to language learning, equipping them with practical and theoretical knowledge essential for effective communication.



A series of **Film Screenings** were organised for post-graduate as well as under-graduate students to provide an engaging and educational experience.

The screening helped students grasp the themes of existentialism, the passage of time, and the human condition, enriching their understanding of modern drama.

The film adaptation allowed students to explore the novel's themes of self-discovery, spirituality, and the clash between tradition and modernity, reinforcing their engagement with Indian literature in English.

She discussed how AI is reshaping job roles and potentially replacing certain traditional jobs, while also creating new opportunities.



In association with the Placement cell, the Department organised a webinar on **Career Opportunities and Placements** on January 24, 2025. The webinar was conducted by Triedge, an integrated career platform for the ambitious professionals, students and interns. The expert highlighted the importance of developing the industry relevant skillset in students. Journey of Start-ups was also discussed with students. The experts talked about Artificial Intelligence, Quantum Computing, Cloud Computing Architectures, Digital Currency and Cyber Security as the key areas where the students should focus for better employment opportunities.

The Department organised an **Inter-Class IT Quiz Competition** sponsored by Infomaths Pvt Ltd on March 06, 2025. The motive of this competition was to make the students aware of the emerging trends in IT field. Moreover, this initiative aimed to foster a sense of healthy competition, team work and intellectual engagement among the students. 16 teams (with two participants each) participated in this competition and Six teams qualified for the final round. Winners of First, Second and Third positions were awarded with trophies and certificates.



DEPARTMENT OF FINE ARTS

The Department celebrated **Akshay Urja Diwas** on August 20, 2024, with a poster making session on the theme 'Go Green with Clean Energy'. The objective was to highlight the importance of renewable energy sources and environmental sustainability. Their artwork emphasized the need to adopt green energy to combat climate change and reduce carbon footprints. The posters were displayed in the college corridor to inspire students and faculty members towards eco-friendly practices.



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Promoting healthy eating habits, the second segment of the drive focused on the theme **'Eat Right, Stay Bright'**. This activity was organised on September 12, 2024, which illustrated the significance of balanced nutrition, organic food, and mindful eating. The posters creatively showcased the benefits of consuming fresh fruits, vegetables, whole grains, and the dangers of junk food.

To spread awareness about HIV/AIDS, the third theme of the drive was organised on November 11, 2024 **'Know AIDS'.** The posters highlighted crucial information on HIV prevention, stigma reduction, and the importance of early diagnosis and treatment. Many artworks carried impactful slogans and visuals, educating viewers about the significance of safe practices and the need to support those affected by HIV/AIDS.





A **Slogan Writing Session** was conducted to promote voter awareness among students on January 27, 2025. The theme emphasized the importance of voting as a fundamental right. A total of 40 students participated in this activity, creating posters that encouraged responsible voting, highlighted the power of the power of vote in democracy, and addressed common misconceptions about elections.

A **Pot Restoration Activity** was successfully conducted on January 30, 2025. The initiative aimed to educate students on traditional restoration techniques, emphasizing the preservation of artistic and cultural heritage. During the session, students engaged in hands-on learning, carefully restoring damaged pots using eco-friendly materials and traditional methods. They explored various techniques such as cleaning, mending, and surface finishing to enhance the structural and aesthetic integrity of the artifacts.



DEPARTMENT OF HINDI

The Department organised **Rangoli Making Competition** on **Hindi Diwas**, which was open to all students of the college, aimed to celebrate the rich cultural heritage of India while also paying tribute to the national language, Hindi. The competition provided a platform for students to express their creativity through the art of Rangoli, a traditional Indian form of decoration. The event was conducted on September 14, 2024.

DEPARTMENT OF HISTORY

The Department organised an exhibition in collaboration with the Panjab Digital Library, with which it had signed an MOU. The event took place from July 17 to 19, 2024 in Mata Ganga Auditorium. The exhibition, titled 'The Sikh Empire, 1710-1849: Perspective by International Artists and Authors,' featured paintings, rare artifacts, and newspaper clippings that highlighted the rise, expansion, and cultural influence of the Sikh Empire. It included over 80 prints of lithographs, maps, and paintings, digitised under the guidance of Sardar Davinderpal Singh from the Panjab Digital Library.

On September 02, 2024, the Department held 'Exhibition on Historical Artifacts' to showcase a variety of items, including Harappan seals, Ashoka's emblem, architectural monuments, and coins from different eras, such as the Sultanate, Lodhi, Mughal, Banda Bahadur, and Maharaja Ranjit Singh's reign. Visitors also saw a map of Maharaja Ranjit Singh's empire, paintings of the Anglo-Sikh wars, and rare newspaper clippings from 1846 and 1849.



Additionally, the exhibition displayed rare books like the *Mahankosh*, writings of Bhai Veer Singh, *Babarnama*, and works on the Silk Routes and Punjab's cultural heritage. An art gallery showcased paintings depicting the life of Guru Gobind Singh, after whom the college is named. Around 100 students attended the exhibition and learned valuable historical insights through the visual displays.

DEPARTMENT OF MUSIC

Department of Music (Instrumental) provides curricular and co-curricular experiences to students that promote the study and performance of instrumental music. The students tried to play different instruments and sing religious, patriotic and folksongs in the workshop which helped them understand the power of music to relax the nerves and remain happy.

'Run for Fun' was organised to promote fitness, teamwork, and healthy lifestyle on August 29, 2024. The event was attended by 36 enthusiastic participants.






Volunteers initiated 'Poshan Maah' from September 17, 2024 focusing on various activities aimed at promoting health and nutrition. Key ac

IQAC

The SSR of the College was submitted in April, 2024, covering the period from 2018-19 to 2022-23. After DVV process, a Peer Team was constituted by NAAC to visit the institution and validate the Self Study Report. The Peer Team consisted of the Chairperson, Dr Parimal Vyas (Vice Chancellor, The Maharaja Sayajirao University of Baroda, Gujarat); Member Coordinator, Dr. Vishal Goyal (Director, Punjabi University) and Member, Dr Diptirani Christian (Principal, Hislop College, Maharashtra). They visited the College from August 20-21, 2024. The team had meetings with the Principal and Core IQAC members.

WORKSHOPS AND CAREER COUNSELLING SESSIONS

A Workshop on Girl Child Empowerment and Personality Development was organised on January 24, 2025 in collaboration with the organization named Procter & Gamble. The session focused on empowering young women, building self-confidence, and enhancing personality development. Career counselling was also provided, guiding students on various career pathways and strategies for personal growth. The interactive nature of the workshop encouraged students to actively participate and seek personalised advice from industry experts.



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Self-Empowerment Workshop 'Be Your Own Boss' was conducted on January 28, 2025 by RCED (Regional Centre for Entrepreneurship Development). This workshop emphasized self-reliance and entrepreneurship. The facilitators explained the Prime Minister's Employment Generation Programme (PMEGP), outlining how students could leverage government schemes to start their own businesses. The session inspired attendees to think innovatively and consider entrepreneurial ventures as viable career options.

'Resume Writing and LinkedIn Profile Creation' was organised by Placement cell on February 11, 2025. PLACEMENT DRIVES

The Placement Cell's efforts during this period were focused towards holistic student development, blending career readiness with personal empowerment. The workshops and counselling sessions equipped students with vital skills, while the placement drive provided them with concrete job opportunities. Moving forward, the Cell aims to continue fostering industry connections, organising skill-building events, and enhancing students' career prospects.





The Placement Drive by eClerx Pvt Ltd took place on February 24, 2025. The event began with a preplacement talk, where representatives from eClerx provided insights into the company, its work culture, and the various roles available. Following the talk, individual interviews were held to shortlist candidates. The next step involved a Group Discussion, where shortlisted candidates demonstrated their communication skills, critical thinking, and ability to collaborate effectively in teams.

At the end of the process, candidates had one final interview at the company campus, where their overall performance was assessed for final selection. Around 100 students participated and 32 students were selected for final round.

Victory Against Drug Abuse Club

The College was awarded a **Certificate of Appreciation by the Department of Higher Education**, Chandigarh Administration, for outstanding contribution in spreading awareness for prevention of drug abuse through activities conducted by VADA club under Nasha Mukt Bharat Abhiyaan. The certificate was awarded by Sh Gulab Chand Kataria, Governor of Punjab and UT Administrator at a State level function, held on February 21, 2025.

The Club organised a **Pledge taking Ceremony** under the theme of 'Viksit Bharat ka Mantra, Bharat Ho Nashe se Swatantra' on August 12, 2024. Students of new classes were made aware of the mandate of the VADA Club and encouraged to participate in the upcoming events of the club.



A **10-Member NMBA Hostel Committee,** comprising of a Nodal Officer, the Warden of the hostel, a Counsellor, and six Resident Student Representatives was constituted as per the directions of the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment and the Department of Higher Education, Chandigarh.

The Club, in association with Legal Literacy Club organised a special lecture on the topic 'Police Infrastructure to Tackle Drug Abuse' on August 30, 2024. The lecture was delivered by Advocate Ishan Dogra from the State Legal Services Authority. Mr Dogra highlighted the various legal issues and provisions related to drug abuse, including NDPS. He also apprised the students about global challenges in the field of drug manufacture, sale and consumption.

Nasha Mukt Bharat Abhiyan Hostel Committee organised an Orientation Programme for hostel residents on September 20, 2024.



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More than 100 students attended the session. NMBA hostel committee was introduced to the hostel interns. A counselling session was organised and discussion was held on the topic of substance abuse as well as coping mechanisms to deal with stress. Students also presented a *Nukkad Natak* to show the after effects of substance abuse.

A Paper Reading Competition on Depiction of Drug Abuse in Literary Texts, in association with Department of Punjabi was organised on September 24, 2024. The participants highlighted several aspects relating to drug abuse in Punjabi literature and the Sikh scripture, *Sri Guru Granth Sahib* including avoidance of intoxication, emphasis on sobriety, rejection of alcohol and other addictive substances and the body as a sacred temple. First Prize was bagged by Prabhjot Kaur of BA II, Sarabjit Kaur and Rajni of B Com I stood second, while Monika of BA III secured the third prize.



The club organised a Capacity Building Workshop on 'Youth Leadership in Nasha Mukt Bharat Abhiyan: Paving the Way for a Viksit Bharat 2047 with Drug-free Institutions' led by Mr Dikshant Sharma, Field Expert—MV, Research & Evaluation, Nasha Mukt Bharat Abhiyaan, Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Govt. of India on October 25, 2024. The resource person highlighted the problem of drug abuse among young people using several case studies and data. The students were made aware of the causes behind drug addiction and ways to prevent this problem through self-awareness and self-control.

The Club organised a Workshop on 'Music Therapy: An Alternative to the Intoxication of Drugs' on January 27, 2025. The workshop was conducted by Dr Lucky Malhotra, Head, Department of Instrumental Music of the College. The resource person highlighted the therapeutic impact of music on the mind and body, as opposed to the havoc drugs wreck on our bodies. The participants tried their hands at musical instruments and enjoyed the stress relief music offers.



Another workshop on 'The Importance of Nutrition as a Counter to Craving for Drugs' was organised on March 10, 2025. The workshop was conducted by Ms Jasneet Malhi, Head, Department of Home Science of the College. The resource person explained nutrition's role in substance abuse prevention and recovery. Students were sensitised to how a well-balanced diet can help regulate mood, support brain health, manage withdrawal symptoms, boost immune system and overall health. Apart from this, students also participated in several Inter-College Competitions organised under the aegis of NMBA and Department of Social Welfare, Chandigarh Administration.



NMBA Hostel Committee and VADA Club organised a Pre exam activity, 'De-stress with Yoga' for the college students residing in hostel as well as day scholars under the Nasha Mukt Bharat Abhiyan on April 09, 2025. Ms Amit Chahal, an International Medalist and General Secretary, Chandigarh Yogasana Association was the resource person. He is known for his popular Coursera course 'A Life of Happiness and Fulfilment' and his acclaimed 2016 book 'If You're So Smart, Why Aren't You Happy?' The virtual event was organised by the **Rekhi Foundation in collaboration with IIM Ranchi** as part of their ongoing initiatives to promote the science of well-being.

Students and faculty members participated in an informative online International Workshop focused on the 'Fundamentals of Electroencephalography (EEG): Research and Applications'. The workshop provided valuable insights into experimental design, research methodologies, and practical applications of EEG technology in understanding brain activity. A **Pledge on Green Diwali** was taken by students on October 19, 2024. Students made posters to raise awareness about the importance of Eco-Friendly Diwali and celebrating this Festivalof Lights in a sustainable and environmentally responsible way.

An **Expert Talk** was held on February 05, 2025, where Mr Sushil Dogra, Scientist with Chandigarh Pollution Control Committee, emphasized the importance of energy conservation and renewable resources. He further delved into the novel projects of Chandigarh Administration, under LiFE, and motivated students to make the campus plastic free by using paper and cloth bags.

Electoral Literacy Club

The Electoral Literacy Club (ELC) is an initiative aimed at fostering awareness and promoting active participation in the electoral process. The club is designed to educate students and the community about the importance of elections, voting rights, and the democratic process. Through a series of engaging activities, the ELC encourages individuals to become informed and responsible citizens, empowering them to make informed decisions when they cast their votes.



An informative and engaging **Awareness Camp** was organised on July 25, 2024 with the objective of raising awareness about the electoral process and encouraging active participation in the democratic process. The camp was aimed at educating students and the local community about the importance of voting, the rights and responsibilities of voters, and the procedures involved in elections.

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An **Expert Lecture** on the theme of 'Indian Democracy' was delivered by Ms Prabhjot Kaur, Associate Professor, Department of Political Science, Guru Gobind Singh College for Women, sector 26, Chandigarh on August 07, 2024.

Throughout the week following the Independence Day, faculty members informed students on the topic 'Main Bharat Hoon: Hum Bharat ke Matdata hain'. Students were addressed by teachers on the importance of being an alert voter.

On September 28, 2024 a class-to-class awareness drive was conducted where trained volunteers and student representatives visited each class to provide students with detailed information about the **Voter Helpline App**, developed by the **Election Commission of India** which serves as a one-stop solution for voters, offering essential services such as voter registration, finding polling stations, checking voter details, and addressing election-related queries.



As part of the ongoing efforts to promote electoral awareness and encourage voter participation, a **Voter Card Registration Drive** was held on October 9, 2024 and November 26, 2024. The drive aimed to assist eligible students in registering for their voter IDs and filling out the necessary forms for voter card issuance.

National Voter Day was celebrated on January 25, 2025. The celebration began with a **Voter's Oath ceremony**. Students, along with faculty members, took the oath to uphold their duty as responsible citizens and pledge to participate in the democratic process by casting their votes in upcoming elections. **Poster Making and Rangoli Making** competitions were also held on the same day.

On March 8, 2025, officials from the Election Commission and the Department of Higher Education (DHE) conducted an informative camp in the College. The same was aimed at enhancing voter awareness and encouraging students to engage in the electoral process.

Ms Suparna Randhawa, the ELC Nodal Officer was accorded a Certificate of Appreciation in recognition of her sincere dedicated contribution of conducting SVEEP activities and spreading voter awareness and electoral literacy among students/youth during the General Elections to Lok Sabha-2024. The same was awarded during the celebration of 15th National Voters' Day by Director School Education-cum-AERO, UT, Chandigarh on January 25, 2025.

The Legal Literacy Club

It strives to enhance legal knowledge and empower individuals with the understanding of the law, its processes, and how it impacts everyday life. The Rotaract Club of Guru Gobind Singh College for Women is a dynamic youth-led organisation dedicated to community service, leadership development, and social impact. Parented under Rotary Club Chandigarh Midtown, Chandigarh District 3080, our club provides a platform for young individuals to engage in meaningful service projects, professional growth, and networking opportunities. Annually, the club holds an installation ceremony to appoint the new board members who govern the club for the upcoming session. For the 2024-2025 session, Ms Diksha served as President, and Ruchi Singh as Secretary, along with nine other board members. The Club comprised of a total of thirty two active members who participated in various events throughout the session. With a strong commitment to 'Service Above Self,' the focus of the club is on initiatives that empower communities, promote literacy, support women's welfare, and contribute to sustainable development.

The Rotaract Club organised **Annapurna**, on July 03, 2024 and July 04, 2024, a **Food Donation Drive** aimed at providing meals to underprivileged individuals and feeding stray animals across Tricity. With 14 students participating, the initiative successfully distributed food and snacks, ensuring nourishment for those in need.

The **Leadership Training Program**, held at Panjab University, was organised by District 3080 on July 21, 2024 to equip rotaractors with essential leadership skills. Five students from the club attended this event, where they gained insights into teamwork, project management, and effective leadership.



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An **Orientation Session** was conducted on July 27, 2024, on Google Meet, with 19 students and 1 staff member in attendance. The session provided an overview of the club's functioning, responsibilities, and impact, ensuring that members clearly understood their roles.

To raise funds for the club, 'Festiverse' was organised in the College campus on September 14, 2024, engaging 15 students in various fun-filled activities. The fundraiser featured hair braiding, hand and face painting, games, and interactive sessions, successfully generating financial support for future Rotaract projects.

The initiative aimed to promote better hygiene practices and empower women with essential knowledge about their health.

The event encouraged awareness and future participation in blood donation drives.



The **Installation Ceremony** of the Rotaract Club took place on September 18, 2024 in the College with 28 students attending the same. This formal event marked the induction of new leadership and the outlining of objectives for the upcoming tenure.



Throughout September, the **Ripple of Kindness Initiative** encouraged students of the club to engage in small acts of goodwill across Tricity. Activities included helping strangers, donating essentials, and spreading positivity, inspiring both participants and the community to contribute towards a more compassionate society.

The Rotaract Club celebrated **Diwali** with the girls at **Nari Niketan**, **Sector 26**, **Chandigarh** along with all the clubs of Zone 3, where seven students participated in distributing sweets, lighting diyas, rangoli making and fun games. The event created a festive and joyful atmosphere, spreading love and warmth among the residents.





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To promote first aid awareness, **Project Chikitsa** was undertaken on October 28, 2024 across Tricity, with 10 students distributing first aid kits and educating people about their importance in emergencies.

As part of the **Vocal for Local** campaign, eight students of the club supported small vendors across Tricity by promoting their products through social media. The campaign was organised to boost sales and visibility for local businesses, fostering economic growth within the community.

This district event aimed to improve menstrual hygiene and support women's health.



On December 31, 2024, as part of **Project Shaya - Bori Beds for Dogs**, two students set up bori beds for stray dogs in Zirakpur. This initiative aimed to support animal welfare by providing warmth and comfort to stray animals during the winter months. Throughout the cold January month, under the **Selfless Sewa** initiative, eight students regularly fed stray animals across Tricity, sharing portions of their meals.
