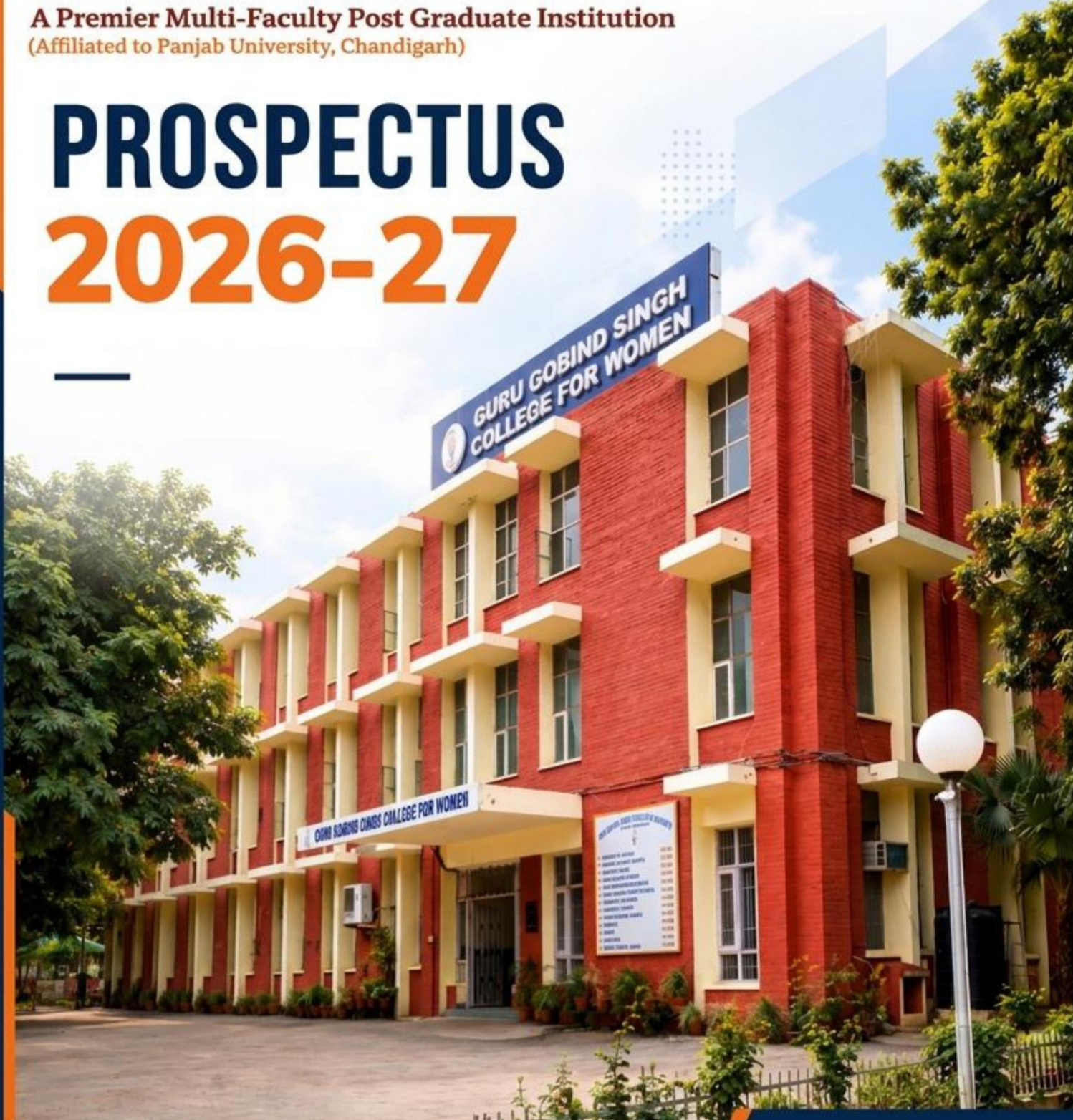

Fully Wi-Fi enabled, 11 acre sprawling campus endowed with an expanse of infrastructure which includes all the latest facilities, well-equipped laboratories, well-stocked library, Mata Kheevi Hostel, Seminar Room, Mata Ganga Auditorium, Mata Gujri Fitness Centre, an Open Air Gym, Student's Centre, expansive grounds, 400 mtrs Athletic Track etc.

English Language Lab. for Ability Enhancement course, with state-of-the-art equipment and facilities, well stocked with Language Skills Software. Laboratories in Physics, Chemistry, Computer Science Departments boast of latest equipment and resources. Various learning resources are available to develop proficiency in academics. Advanced learners are provided with extra reference books/material by faculty members who set suitable goals for the students to feel adequately challenged.

The Students' Centre houses a Stationery Shop and Photostat Facility. The College takes pride in being the Best Maintained Campus in Chandigarh, winning the First prize at the Annual Rose Festival, a feat which the College has been consistently accomplishing since 2008.

## Library

The College Library has a Blog ([ggscwlibrary.blogspot.in](http://ggscwlibrary.blogspot.in)), a digital space for students to access question papers from previous years, pages/ links of various activities and achievements of the staff and students, newspaper clippings, latest Panjab University syllabus, and links to various open access e-resources. The Library initiated **Gyankosh**: an Institutional Repository, where the faculty members contributed their recorded e-lectures in the form of PPTs, audio/ video lectures and PDFs, accessible through the Blog. The Library provides an Open Access system, making it an ideal place for the users to expand and widen their knowledge. Well stocked with around 24,400 books and 490+ CDs on different subjects, the collection is enriched with Reference Books, Coffee Table Books, Light Reading Books like Fiction, Self-help, Biographies of eminent personalities, etc.

Total 9 magazines and Journals as well as 6 Newspapers are also subscribed to by the Library on annual basis. Library homes the 'Book Bank' that consist of more than 2000 books on different subjects which are lent out for the full session to the needy as well as meritorious students.

To display the fresh arrivals, there is a display stand in the Library and an LED for highlighting the services of Library.

**KHOJ**: The Wall Magazine show cases the creative works of the students. Library is fully automated with Campus Whizz ERP software.

A striking feature of the library is **Learning Resource Centre** on the first floor, where students have added facility for their research oriented activities.

The Library also has a Braille Corner, where one computer with NVDA (Non Visual Digital Access) software for the Blind is installed. The College has subscribed to e-Journals under the scheme of NLIST programme of INFLIBNET, UGC.

There is a separate reading room for students to read their personal documents/ books. Each year students enrolled in the College are oriented towards Library services and facilities.



On joining the College, each student is issued an Identity-cum-library Card bearing her photograph, name, address, class and roll number. All the students are required to carry their Identity Card with them during their presence in the campus. In case of loss of Identity-cum-library Card, a duplicate card will be issued on payment.

## General Rules

- The Library remains open from Monday to Friday, 9am to 4pm, Saturday, 9am to 1:30pm.
- Silence to be maintained in the Library.
- Use of cellular phones is strictly prohibited in the library premises.
- No personal belongings are allowed inside the library.
- Library does not accept any responsibility for loss or damage to personal property left on its premises.
- Enter your name and sign in the entry register kept at the entrance before entering the library.
- Show the books and other materials which are being taken out of the library to the staff at the entrance counter.
- The librarian may recall any book from member at any time and it is obligatory for the member to return the same immediately.
- Library borrower cards/tickets are not transferable. The borrower is responsible for the books borrowed on his/her cards.
- After reading, leave books on the table. Please do not shelve the books.
- Ask for the help from library staff if you are unable to find your required material

## Circulation Rules

- Books will be issued on presentation of the library tickets.
- Students are instructed to check the books while borrowing and they will be responsible for any type of damage.
- Number of books issued to a student of Graduate classes. Part I/II/III is two and of MA/M Com class and Honors is three; period of retention of books allowed in each case is 14 days.
- The loss of member/reader ticket should be immediately reported to the librarian. The holder of this ticket shall be personally responsible for any loss which the library might suffer due to misuse of the missing ticket by anyone at a later stage.
- Book Lost, defaced or spoilt in any way will have to be replaced by the borrower. In case of set of Volumes, price for the whole set will be realized along with fine.

## Digital Library Rules

Digital Library is to be used for academic purposes only.

- Users are not allowed to carry eatables and drinks in the Digital Library area.
- Readers must carry their Library ID card while using the Digital Library. They must show their ID card on demand.
- Changing the settings and display of the Computer systems kept in the Digital Library is not allowed
- Playing games on Library computer systems is strictly prohibited in the premises.
- Students should take care of their Pen drives, CD/DVD ROMs, Cell Phones, and Wallets etc.
- Online chatting, browsing of dating and porn websites in the Digital Library is strictly prohibited. Strict disciplinary action will be taken against the defaulters.

Periodic inspection and renovation of the Hostel is undertaken to ensure comfort and hygiene levels to the residents. Facilities of Fitness Centre, Indoor Games and LCD TV are provided to the inmates. All necessary furniture is provided in each room. The Hostel is equipped with amenities like water coolers, geysers and washing machines. Fire extinguishers along with water-pipes are also installed in the Hostel to avoid any fire incident. CCTV cameras have been installed at specific points to keep strict vigil.

Students seeking admission to the hostel must apply on a separate prescribed form appended to the Hostel Prospectus available on the College website.

**NOTE:** All Admissions will be Provisional and subject to Scrutiny of the Admission Form and Verification of Original Documents (Online)

## Reservation of Seats/ Fee Concession

Reservation of seats in different categories viz, Sports, Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Physically Challenged Persons, Wards of Freedom Fighters Wards of Defence and Paramilitary Personnel and Economically Weaker Section will be made in accordance with the rules and instructions framed by the Chandigarh Administration, whereas in case of Kashmiri Migrants and Kashmiri Pandit/ Kashmiri Hindu Families (non-migrants living in Kashmiri Valley), Victims of November 1984 Riots and Terrorism (Free Education only), Kargil Martyrs, Single Girl Child/ One out of two Girl Children, Cancer/ AIDS/ Thalassemia, Rural Area Students, Students from Jammu and Kashmir, Border Area Students, Transgender Students and Excellence in Youth Festival will be made as per instructions issued by Panjab University Chandigarh from time to time.

### NOTE:

1. All the affiliated colleges of Chandigarh (U.T.) shall follow the reservation policy of Union Territory Administration.
2. All the affiliated colleges of Punjab State shall follow the reservation policy of the Punjab Government.

### 1. General Information:

- Every candidate applying for admission against reserved seats, belonging to any category, could also be considered for admission against the open seats of the respective quota, as per his/her merit. Depending on his/her preference for a college/course, a candidate may take admission against his/her reserved category or against the open category.
- Any candidate who applies in more than one reserved category will be considered in each reserved category in which he/she applies for admission, maintaining his/her internal seniority in each reserved category on the basis of merit in that category. In such a case, the candidate will get the benefit in one category of his/her choice.
- In case, seats belonging to any reserved category (except for additional seats) remain unfilled for want of eligible candidates, the same may be filled from amongst open category candidates belonging to the same quota.

The reservation of seats shall be governed by the Regulation 29.1 and 29.2 given at Page No.169 in Panjab University Calendar Volume-I, 2022 and any intimation sent by the Deputy Registrar (Colleges). However, it is clarified that the reservation of seats/fee concession is not available in the case of candidates who are seeking admission to the next higher class on the basis of having earned compartment in +2 examinations i.e. in the subject of compartment.

The affiliated Colleges situated in the territorial jurisdiction of U.T. Administration, Chandigarh shall follow the reservation policy of U.T. Administration, Chandigarh for the various categories whereas the affiliated Colleges situated in the State of Punjab shall follow the reservation policy of Government of Punjab.

As per letter No. DHE-UT-C6-12(2)2004P/F-VII/2076, Dated 28.05.2024 following seat matrix will be followed upto the date of admission for each course. The Reservation for admission to OBC Students will be 3% of UT pool starting from the current academic session 2026-27.

Relaxation of % of marks for the purpose of determining eligibility for various categories viz. SC/ST/OBC (non-creamy Layer)/BC/Differently abled candidates shall be given as per the guidelines of the respective Governments.

- Orphan Children (Approved by Hon'ble Vice Chancellor as per authority given by the Senate vide Para 1 meeting dated 10.02.2024 to exercise power of Syndicate),
- Two supernumerary seats (one male and one female) created for orphan children in every Academic Program at DG/PG level.
- The Student seeking admission shall have to submit/upload certificate from a Govt. recognized Orphanage/Charitable Home or Death Certificate of both the Parents.
- Blind students who join a regular degree / Post-graduate degree courses at the Panjab University (Campus/Departments) would be allowed exemption from payment of tuition fee & would be provided free accommodation in the University Hostels. (Approved vide Syndicate Para (iv) meeting held on 19.08.1996).
- The free education to the completely blind student belonging to below poverty line, as described by the relevant Government notifications, in any course in the University and its affiliated Colleges, subject to the students being otherwise eligible and on merit, but the candidate has to submit an affidavit to this effect issued by the competent authority, Even the free hostel accommodation may also be considered, if required by the students, but he/she will have to pay the mess charges, which are already subsidized. A limited number of course books (one per paper) may also be considered which would be returnable after the completion of the course. (Syndicate Para-1 dated 18.04.2009).

## Late Admissions



- a. Permission of the Vice-Chancellor, Panjab University is necessary for admission after the expiry of the last date for admission given with Principal's permission.
- b. A student, whose result of 10+2 examination has not been declared by the
- c. In case of late declaration of result by Panjab University, normal admission will take place within 10 working days of declaration of the result. This rule will not apply to a candidate who passes the lower examination from any other University/Board.

School Board, may be admitted without late fee within 15 working days of the declaration of the result, depending upon the availability of seats and the fact that the Admission Form has been submitted as 'Result Awaited Case' before the last date of submission of Admission Forms. The attendance of such a student shall be counted from the date of admission. This would be applicable to Open School also. After expiry of this period, late admission approval from the Vice-Chancellor is required.

## General / Compartment Rules for UG Courses

### General Instructions

1. Admission to all classes will be Online. Physical submission of the College Admission Form is not allowed.
2. Applicants will be admitted strictly in accordance with the rules and regulations in the Panjab University calendar/guidelines/ and other instruction which have been or may be issued by PU/DHE-UT from time to time.
3. Registration Fee will not be refunded under any circumstances.
4. Applicants must check the College website for Admission Schedule and
5. Merit list for Admission to various courses.
5. An affidavit in duplicate from each candidate having gap year seeking admission to the College/Department to the effect that she was not disqualified by any Board/Body/Council/University and she was not already registered with the Panjab University (wherever applicable), must be obtained by the concerned College/Department before allowing admission. In case the candidate was disqualified, the period of disqualification and the activities in which the candidate was involved during the period of

disqualification, should be indicated by the candidate in the said affidavit. A copy of the affidavit be sent to the University (R&S Branch) along with Registration Return. No candidate be admitted under any circumstances during the disqualification period. In case of re-admission after a long spell, the candidate must quote her old Registration Number of the Panjab University.

6. The candidate who is admitted in first/third/fifth semester will be allowed to be promoted to second/fourth/sixth semester respectively. However, for promotion from second to third or from fourth to fifth semester the candidate will have to clear 50% of the total papers till that semester. It is further clarified that for calculating 50% fraction, like, 2.5, 3.5 or 4.5 will be considered as 3, 4 or 5 respectively.
7. The candidates, who got admission in 1st Semester in a College and after completing the 1st Semester, could

not get the admission in 2nd Semester due to one or other reason, are being allowed admission in the 2nd Semester next year with the condition that the candidate must have attended the classes/appeared in examination in the College in 1st Semester, this provision/facility be extended to the candidates of 3rd and 5th Semester as well. Such a facility be extended to Post-Graduate students also. To overcome this problem, few admission dates for 2nd semester should also be allotted in January i.e. one week after the Winter Break as per P.U. Academic Calendar. (As per Syndicate Para 49 dated 01.05.2016).

8. The Vice-Chancellor has allowed to change a subject in any circumstances in the even semester examination whereas she will have to clear that subject as deficient in lower semesters examination which she has changed in the higher semester for qualifying the award of Bachelor's Degree (Vide Circular No. Misc./A-6/3295 dated 06-04-2018).



## Compartment Rules

A candidate who has been placed under compartment in the 10+2 examination conducted by a Board / Body / Council / University in India shall be eligible to seek admission in first year of Undergraduate Programme provided she fulfills the following conditions:-

1. A candidate should have been placed in compartment in one subject only.
2. A candidate should have obtained at least 20% marks in the subject in which she has been placed in compartment (theory and practical taken together).
3. A candidate should have obtained 33% in the aggregate of all the subjects (including the marks obtained by her in the subject of compartment) taken by her in the +2 examination.
4. The candidate securing less than 20%

Students from other Colleges affiliated to Panjab University, Chandigarh, may be allowed to migrate with the prior permission of the concerned Principals and as per the University rules and regulations. He/she has to submit College Leaving Certificate from the previous College along with the other certificates.

- a) No migration will be permitted to any student with a combination of subjects which is not offered by the College.
- b) Students who are not from Panjab University, Chandigarh, are required to submit the migration certificate
- c) Mid-term migration from any other University is not allowed.

\*A candidate who has passed her first Semester and second Semester of B.A./B.Sc. (General)/B.Com./B.B.A./B.C.A. Course

marks in the subject in which she has been placed in compartment at the 10+2 examination under semester system shall not be eligible to seek admission to the first year of B.A./ B.Com/BCA course/s.

5. \*A student of any other University, who is placed in the compartment in 1st & 2nd Semester/3rd & 4th Semester of B.A./ B.C.A./ B.Com/B.Sc Course will not be allowed to join the 3rd & 4th Semester 5th & 6th Semester of this University.

The admission of the candidate with a compartment as indicated above shall be provisional and will be confirmed only after the candidate has cleared the compartment in one consecutive chance subsequent to the qualifying examination. In case the candidate does not clear the compartment at one chance allowed to candidate subsequent to the date of the qualifying examination, the provisional admission of the candidate to the course shall stand cancelled.

## Migration Rules

conducted by another University/College affiliated to another university in India under specific authorization by the University concerned, be allowed to migrate to a College affiliated to this University/Department of Evening Studies/University School of Open Learning in the 3 semester/5 semester of the respective course (as per rules prescribed under Chapter XIV –'Migration of Students' Page No.292 to 309 of P.U. Calendar Volume-III, 2019) on the condition that such a candidate will have to clear the deficient subject(s) if any, within the permissible chances. Deficiencies should be determined by the Principal/Chairperson at the time of admission under intimation to the University (i.e. on the Registration Return and examination forms) as well as to the students as per University Rule No.6 given at Page No.310-311 of P.U. Calendar Volume – III, 2019.

## Admission Rules for Foreign Students

Admission of the foreign students to the College will be governed by the Guidelines issued by the Dean Foreign Students, PU. Following is the Checklist of Documents for Foreign Students:

1. Original Passport / Visa (whichever applicable)
2. Valid Student Visa
3. A certificate of registration from the local police
4. Date of Birth Certificate with the Father's/

Mother's name

5. An eligibility certificate from the Panjab University to desired course
6. Original letter of certificate from present institution
7. Original Migration Certificate
8. Academic certificates and testimonials
9. Original letters of scholarships in case of those who are Government of India sponsored scholars

## Mid Semester Examinations & Internal Assessment

As per the instructions of Panjab University, Chandigarh, Internal Assessment is based on the result of mid-semester examinations conducted by the College in each paper of all the subjects along with extracurricular activity and attendance (75% minimum).

- A student attending NCC Camps/ Sports/Cultural Activities will seek prior

permission for remaining absent in mid-term exams. She may be allowed to appear in a Special Test, if held at the discretion of the respective HOD.

- A student is required to obtain a minimum of 25% marks in aggregate of all subjects in the House Examinations to be eligible for the University examination.

## College Leave

1. Leave must be applied for well in advance on the Leave Form available in the College Office.
2. An application for leave must be countersigned by the student's parent/guardian.
3. Leave for 3 to 7 days will be granted by the Mentor/Tutor and for more than 7 days by Dean, Academics.

4. In case of serious illness, an authentic medical certificate by Government Physician must be submitted to the College office.
5. If a student is absent from College for more than 10 working days without prior sanctioned leave, her name will be struck off from the College Rolls.

## Internal Complaints Committee

There is a duly constituted Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) in the College as per guidelines of UGC and the Hon'ble Supreme Court. The committee is headed by the Principal. The members of the Committee discuss and inquire into the complaint. This Committee works towards creating a healthy, respectful and congenial atmosphere in the College.

## Student Council

A democratically elected Student Council is constituted every year to inculcate a spirit of Democratic ethos, civil accountability and participation among the students. The Student Council works under the supervision of the Dean Student Welfare (DSW) to assist in the College affairs and activities. It actively organises various social, cultural, literary, sports and community-oriented activities. The Student Council comprises the President, Vice President, General Secretary and Joint Secretary.

## Mentoring

To promote student interaction with the teachers outside the classroom, each student is placed under personal supervision of a mentor. The mentor provides guidance, counsel the students and also keeps a record of progress, to assist the students in attainment of their maximum potential. Mentor Meetings are held regularly.

## Student Counselling Cell

The College believes in providing regular and need-based counselling to its students in order to help them deal with the challenges of the competitive world. There is a trained Counsellor and persistent support from Faculty members for each student of the Institution.



## Placement & Internship Cell

The Placement Cell concentrates on overall development of students by enhancing their technical knowledge and soft skills. Students attend various training programs and placement drives organised in the campus as well as in other Institutions. The Cell also provides support and guidance to students for mandatory Internships as per PU guidelines under NEP 2020.

## Participative Learning Platforms in the College

### National Service Scheme (NSS)

The College has two units of NSS. Number of Seats being limited, volunteers are enrolled on the basis of First-come, First-served. NSS helps to enrich student's personality and deepen their understanding of the social environment. It too helps to enhance socio-economic awareness and encourage the students to impart the same to the community of the area adopted.

The main objective of NSS is to identify the needs and problems of the community and involve the students in problem solving process; to develop competence required for group living and sharing of responsibilities; to help volunteers acquire leadership qualities and democratic attitude and to always practice national integration and social harmony.

Under this scheme, students are engaged in various outreach programmes such as Literacy Campaigns, Blood Donation Camps, Motivational Camps, Awareness Talks, Rural and Urban Projects, etc. Community service ventures give an opportunity to the students to interact with the villagers and slum dwellers, thereby exposing them to the realities of life, and bringing about a positive change in their social perception. NSS Volunteers are required to put in 120 hours of work during the session including a 7-day service camp.



## National Cadet Corps (NCC)

NCC inculcates spirit of discipline and patriotism amongst the students. It helps to broaden their outlook and develop the quality of leadership and spirit of fraternity. The College unit offers Army and Navy Wing. Cadets get opportunity to participate in Annual Training Camp, Army Detachment Camp, National Integration Camp, Basic and Advanced Leadership Camps. Cadets are sensitized to India's diversity in National Integration, Nau Sainik and Thal Sainik Camps, All India Leadership Training and Republic Day Camps. There are other activities that are organised for holistic development of the Cadets, namely regular Drill, firing, swimming, cyclothons, cleanliness drives, ship modelling, boat pulling and community work.

The College NCC unit recruits about 140 cadets, who are given basic training in small arms and parades. As per the NCC rules, a Cadet is required to attend the annual training camp of the unit and undergo service training of 40 parades during the academic session. The holders of NCC, A, B and C certificate shall be given the weightage in marks for admission to various courses in the University teaching departments and its affiliated Colleges. The weightage of marks is as under: A-1% | B-2% | C -3%. The maximum weightage in marks is 4% for distinction in any or all the curricular activities.

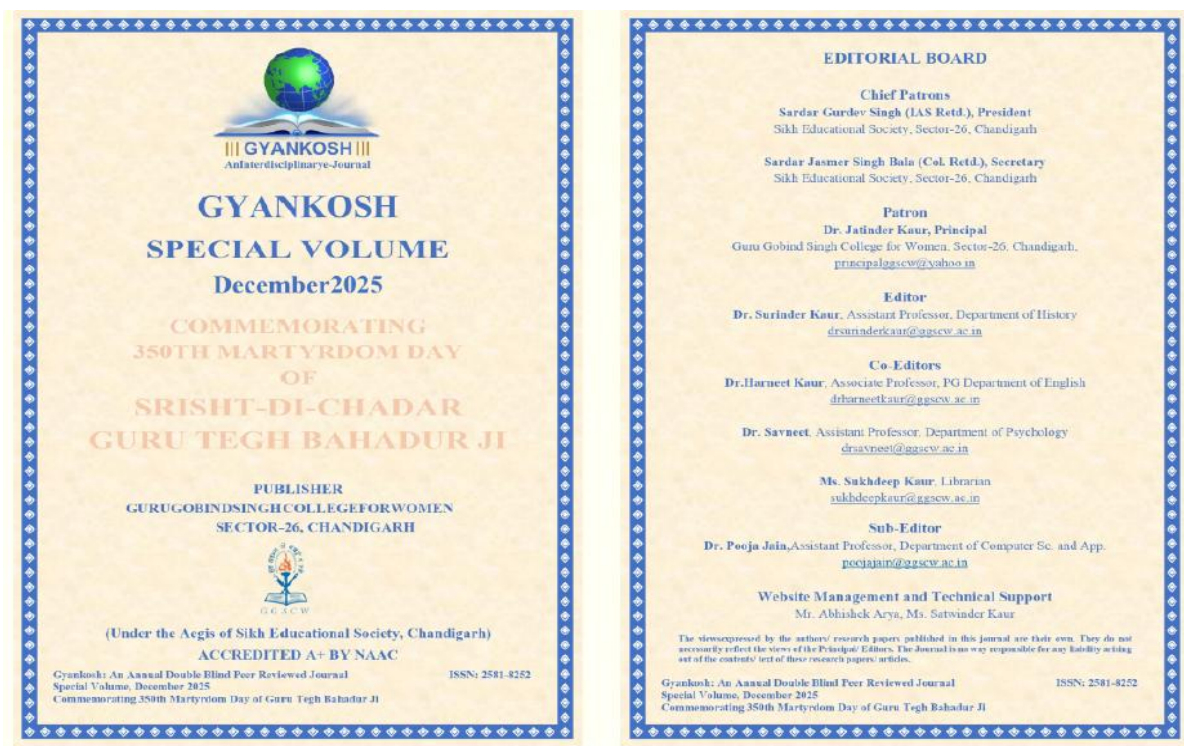


## Gurmat Vichar Sabha

Based on the quality of their inputs, prizes are awarded to the Best Contributors in each section.

## Anti-Ragging

### UGC Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Education Institutions

**Objective :** To eliminate ragging in all its forms from universities, deemed universities and other higher educational institutions in the country by prohibiting it under these Regulations, preventing its occurrence and punishing those who indulge in ragging as provided for in these Regulations and the appropriate law in force.

**Preamble :** In view of the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the matter of "University of Kerala v/s. Council, Principals, Colleges and others" in SLP no. 24295 of 2006 dated 16.05.2007 and that dated 8.05.2009 in Civil Appeal number 887 of 2009, and in consideration of the determination of the Central Government and the University Grants Commission to prohibit, prevent and eliminate the scourge of ragging. ## **National Educational Policy (NEP-2020)**

### **Curriculum and Credit Framework for UG Programmes under NEP, Panjab University, Chandigarh**

The duration of UG Degree (Honours) shall be of 4 years (eight semesters). A student can exit at the end of 3 years (six semesters) and shall be awarded UG Degree. A student can also exit at the end of 2 years (four semesters) shall be awarded UG Diploma. A student can also exit at the end of 1 year (two semesters) and shall be awarded UG Certificate. For obtaining UG Certificate/UG Diploma/UG Degree/ UG Degree (Honours)/UG Degree (Honours with Research), a student shall qualify the number of credits as per these Regulations and Scheme framed in accordance with these Regulations.

#### **UG Certificate:**

The student who opts to exit after completion of the first year and has secured minimum 48 credits shall be awarded a UG certificate provided she/he secures 6 credits from the skill based courses earned during the 1st and 2nd semesters (included in 48 credits) and completes summer internship/vocational/Apprenticeship course of 4 credits during the summer vacations of the first year. The student shall be allowed to resume within three years and complete the degree programme within the stipulated maximum period of seven years.

#### **UG Diploma:**

The student who opts to exit after completion of the 2nd year and has secured minimum 96 credits shall be awarded the UG diploma provided she/he secures 4 credits from internship/vocational course during the summer vacations of the 2nd year. The student shall be allowed to resume within three years and complete the degree programme within the stipulated maximum period of seven years.

#### **Three year UG Degree:**

The student opting to undergo a 3-year UG programme shall be awarded a UG Degree in the major discipline after a successful completion of 3 years, securing minimum 144 credits including the minimum credit requirements for ability enhancement courses, skill development courses, value added courses, and community engagement/ internship/field based project(s) as given in Table below.

#### **Four year UG Degree (Honours):**

A four-year UG Honours degree in the major discipline shall be awarded to those students who complete a 4-year UG programme successfully with minimum 192 credits including minimum credit requirements for ability enhancement courses, skill development courses, value added courses, and community engagement/internship/ field based project(s) as given in Table below.

#### **Four year UG Degree (Honours with Research):**

The students securing 75% marks and above, in the first six semesters of UG programme shall be allowed to choose a research stream at the undergraduate level in the 4th year. She/he shall complete a research project or dissertation in the major discipline under the guidance of an approved faculty member of the University/College. The student securing minimum 192 credits, including 12 credits from a research project/dissertation fulfilling minimum credit requirements for ability enhancement courses, skill development courses, value added courses, and community engagement/internship/field-based project(s).

## Minimum Credit Requirements to Award Degree under Each Category Opting for Multidisciplinary / Interdisciplinary UG Programmes

### Choices of Courses

Undergraduate students will make course selections from the various lists approved by the College. The choices will fall into categories as outlined below:

**Major Course:** This is the primary subject area a student wishes to delve into during their undergraduate course. It is the area of study that the student is most passionate about and may wish to pursue as a career. Students may be permitted to change their major within the broad discipline at the end of the second semester, providing them with ample time to explore interdisciplinary courses during their first year.

**Minor Course:** This is a secondary area of study that complements the student's chosen Major. Students who complete a sufficient number of courses in a discipline or an interdisciplinary area of study other than their chosen Major will qualify for a Minor in that discipline or interdisciplinary area. A student may declare their choice of Minor and vocational stream at the end of the second semester.

**Ability Enhancement Course (AEC):** These are Modern Indian Language (MIL) & English language courses focused on enhancing language and communication skills. The courses aim to enable students to acquire and demonstrate core linguistic skills, including critical reading and expository and academic writing skills. The courses also emphasize the development and enhancement of skills such as communication, and the ability to participate in/conduct discussion and debate.

## Skill Enhancement Courses

According to the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, Skill Enhancement Courses are designed to provide students with practical skills and knowledge that are relevant to the industry and job market. These courses aim to bridge the gap between academic learning and professional requirements, enabling students to become more employable and competitive in the workforce. SECs focus on practical skill development and are industry-relevant.

## Value Added Courses

Value-added courses, as per the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, are designed to provide students with additional skills and knowledge beyond their core curriculum. These courses aim to enhance employability, promote holistic development, and foster interdisciplinary thinking.

Value-added courses are offered to undergraduate students across disciplines, allowing them to explore interests beyond their major. Value-added courses focus on imparting practical skills, hands-on training, and soft skills to enhance students' employability.

## Multidisciplinary Courses

According to the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, multidisciplinary courses are designed to provide students with a broad-based education that combines multiple disciplines or subjects. These courses aim to foster a holistic understanding of complex issues, promote interdisciplinary thinking, and develop versatile skills. MDCs encourage an interdisciplinary approach, holistic learning, development of versatile skills, foster creativity and innovation and enhance employability.

The College will offer Multidisciplinary Courses in line with NEP 2020. While choosing a subject under Multi-Disciplinary Courses, students will have to keep in mind, the following two restrictions: (a) the student must not have studied that course in 10+2 level (b) the student must not have taken that course as a core subject.

## Summer Internship/Community Engagement & Service/ Field Based Learning

Panjab University has integrated Internships into 3-Year UG degree/4-Year UG Degree (Honours with Research). The internships aim to provide students with structured opportunities for experiential learning, skill enhancement, research aptitude development and exposure to real-world work environment. This MANDATORY internship shall carry 2/4 Academic Credits with a total duration of 60/120 hours.

All students who wish to exit after first year or Second year must complete 4 credits and 120 hours of internship in addition to internship prescribed in their course curriculum. Students must get in touch with their Internship Supervisor at the beginning of the Semester.

## Research/Minor Project

Research Project/Dissertation Requirement for 4-Year Bachelor's Degree (Honours with Research) or students enrolled in the 4-Year Bachelor's Degree program (Honours with Research), it is mandatory to undertake a research project under the supervision of a faculty member in the fourth year. This research project is to be initiated and completed in the eighth semester of the program. The research project is an integral part of the student's academic journey, offering an opportunity to apply theoretical knowledge to practical research.

## Courses of Study

### BA/BA(Hons.) Four Year Undergraduate Programme (under NEP-2020)

#### Discipline Specific Courses

For this Four Year Undergraduate Programme (under NEP-2020). Student is required to select any three subjects of 4 credits each, selecting not more than one subject from any of the following sets of combinations:

- Economics/Fine Arts
- History/Hindustani Classical Music (Instrumental)/Computer Science and Applications
- Public Administration/Home Science
- Political Science
- Sociology
- Physical Education/Psychology
- English/Hindi/Punjabi

**NOTE: A student cannot choose a combination of three practical subjects.**

#### Compulsory Subjects

- Ability Enhancement Course (2 Credits)
- Skill Enhancement Course (3 Credits)
- Value Added Course (2 Credits)
- Multi Disciplinary Course (3 Credits)
- Punjabi/HCP\*

- \* a. Students who are not domicile of Punjab and have not studied Punjabi at Matriculation or 10+2 level either as an elective or additional (optional) subject (vide the Panjab University letter no. ST 9595, dated 3 October, 2011)
- b. Wards of Defence Personnel and Central Govt. Employees who are transferable on all-India basis.
- c. Foreign Students

**Apart from Discipline Specific subjects, student will have to choose One Subject each from the List of Subjects given under Skill Enhancement Course, Value Added Course and Multidisciplinary Course**

*In the first year the student will undergo courses in broad disciplines (major stream, minor stream and multidisciplinary category) to have basic knowledge not only in major (i.e. Core) areas but also in two other (Minor and Multidisciplinary) disciplines.*

*ii) With exposure to basic courses a student shall decide to continue the chosen major or change the major and minor areas of interest at the end of the second semester.*

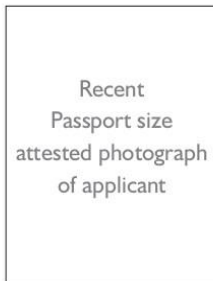
