

SESSION 2022-23


Feedback process is critical for any institution as it gives chance for improvement. Students are our greatest strength and so, their feedback regarding the facilities and infrastructure available to them, holds immense importance to the institution. For this purpose, a survey is conducted every year with the help ofGoogle forms which helps in identifying the gaps. The institution then undertakes corrective measures to help bridge these gaps. During the session 2022-23, a total of 235 students responded to the survey and following is its interpretation and conclusion.

1. The teacher comes well prepared to the class.




It is pertinent that every teacher must prepare themselves well before entering the class. More than 84% students opined that their teacher came to class well prepared for the lecture. Moreover, the College library is well equipped with offline as well as online teaching material for use by the faculty as well as students.

2. The teacher encourages participative learning in the class.





Classroom participation is an important part of any education set up and involves active learning and development of ideas. On being asked whether the teachers were encouraging participation in class, more than 80% of the students agreed to it, while 13.6% remained neutral and only 3.4% disagreed.

3. The teacher discusses course and program outcomes in class.




Definite knowledge about course outcomes allows students to know about the skills they will learn at the end of the program, accompanied with an understanding of what is expected of them. It also allows the teachers to come up with appropriate teaching strategies and assessment methods. On being asked about course outcomes, 76.2% of the students agreed that the teacher discusses course and program outcomes in class, with 17.9% remaining neutral.






Innovation is germane to the success of any institution, especially in this age of technology. Innovative teaching methods need to be employed in order to improve academic outcomes and address the problems faced by students during the learning process. Keeping in line with this, our College provides smart boards and projector boards in most of the classrooms, making them interactive classrooms. Furthermore, the faculty is encouraged to use novel teaching methods to make the teaching learning process more effective. On being asked, 58.7% students agreed that such innovative methods were used, while 22.3% remained neutral.

5. Doubt clearing sessions are taken up by the teacher





Asking questions and resolving doubts helps to develop critical thinking. More than 70% students responded that their teachers took doubt clearing sessions regularly.

6. The teacher completes the entire syllabus




Teachers take classes regularly so that the entire syllabus in completed in time and students have time for revision. A majority of the students (77%) were of the opinion that the syllabus was completed in class while 16.6% remained neutral.

7. Regular and timely feedback is given after each test




Teachers are encouraged to provide timely feedback to students so that there is sufficient time for them to monitor their learning and take steps to promote their understanding of the subject. More than 60% students reported that their teachers gave timely feedback while 29.8% remained neutral.

8. The evaluation process is fair and unbiased





9. Overall quality of teaching and learning is good.





10. The buildings are accessible to differently abled persons.





11. The labs are well maintained and equipment in the labs are in good condition.





12. Photocopy facility is available in the campus.



We have banned the use of single use plastic on campus and we promote the 3 R's (reduce, reuse, recycle). About75% of the respondents agreed that the campus is well maintained and green.




14. The prescribed books and reading material are available in the library

The library is well stocked with online as well as offline study and reference material. The library provides an open access system and houses more than 24,200 books and 490 CDs on various subjects. 38 magazines/ journals and 12 newspapers are also subscribed annually. Students make

use of the online repository to access study material, apart from getting books issued for their use. 74.5% students stated that the library was well stocked while 18.7% remained neutral.

15. Online educational resources are available in the library.





The book bank, with more than 1800 books, also aidsin providing learning material to the students by lending books for the entire session. 64.3% students agreed with the statement while 25.5% students remained neutral.

16. Results and attendance records are discussed in class.



18. Internet is available in the college




Our campus is fully wi-fi enabled with a bandwidth of 850 MBPS. More than 64% students were in agreement, while 18.7% remained neutral.

Ques1) The syllabus provides freedom to adopt new techniques/ strategies of testing and assessment of students.



Ques2) The syllabus imparts value based learning in terms of skill, concepts, knowledge and critical thinking in students.



Ques3) The course/syllabus has a good balance between theory and practical application.



Ques4) The curriculum has the potential of developing the habit of selflearning among the students.



• Participative learning, group discussions, quizzes and presentations are regularly organised.


Ques5) The syllabus taught by me is relevant and the contents are revised at reasonable intervals.

Ques6) The syllabus is designed in a way to improve employability index.


About 50% of teachers agree and 2.4% strongly agree that the syllabus is designed in a way to improve the employability index. Around 38.1% have a neutral view

Ques7) The books prescribed/listed as reference materials are relevant, updated and appropriate.



Ques8) Faculty members are encouraged to invite experts from academia, research institutions and industry in workshops/seminars etc. organised by the respective departments.



• The HoDs of all the departments are constantly motivated to invite experts from academia for Special lectures, seminars and conferences.


Ques9) IQAC/research cell of the institution facilitate faculty for publication and presentation of research papers in National and International Conferences/Workshops.

Ques10) The institution has provision of infrastructural facilities such as laboratories, conference room, seminar room etc.



• College has all the necessary facilities and the authorities work towards updating the same.


Ques11) There is adequate representation of your opinion in Governing body and staff council.

• Timely meetings and suggestions are taken by Principal of the college and the Governing body.




The time table is designed and adjusted to cater to professional and personal needs.

- Time table designed is student centric and the committee remains considerate towards every one.


Ques12) The labs are adequately equipped for hands-on training if students (if applicable) and research




Nearly 61.9 % of the teachers agree and 28.6% strongly agree that the labs are adequately equipped for hands-on training of students and research.

• The labs are adequately equipped and updated accordingly as per the need of curriculum.





Ques14) Numerous opportunities and support is provided by institution for upgrading your skills and qualifications.



• The faculty has the freedom to put forward the ideas of guest lecture series, seminars, conferences and webinars.




Ques15) Consideration towards grievances by Head of respective Department.

• The HoDs of all the departments consider the concern of faculty emphatically.


Ques16) There are ICT facilities and adequate IT infrastructure for applications in teaching and learning.

Ques17) The syllabus is directly related to enhancing practical competencies.





- Each faculty member has to submit a hard copy of the marks which is further uploaded on the University examination portal.




Ques19) The faculty members assist each other on various academic issues.

Ques20) The college library has adequate and relevant books and access to eresources in my subject.



Ques21) The institution provides learning opportunities for career advancement and skill development.



Ques22) There is a mechanism of feedback, review and performance enhancement of the staff.




Nearly 59.5% agree and 26.2% strongly agree that the training for using Smart Boards was highly effective whereas 14.3% have a neutral view point.

- The sanitary in charge of the college takes suggestions from faculty members regarding cleanliness of the washrooms.





1. The curriculum is relevant and meets the requirements of the industry.






2. The electives/specialization offered by the college provides technical knowledge to the students.



3. The curriculum incorporates changes according to the evolving needs of the industry.







5. The institution has instilled good values and professional ethics in its students.





6. Subject knowledge of the graduates is good in relation to the programme curriculum.







- 4. To facilitate communication and support, we have prominently displayed helpline numbers on the College website, admission brochure, and the Prospectus.


These initiatives aim to streamline and simplify the admission process, making it more accessible and user-friendly for our students and their families.

COLLEGE ENVIRONMENT





This feedback underscores the strong and positive connection between the faculty and the students, highlighting the faculty's dedication to student success and well-being.


TEACHING LEARNING PROCESS


OTHER STAFF

demonstrates that the other staff members consistently and enthusiastically extend their support to students.


QUALITY AND SUPPORT MATERIAL



LIBRARY





COLLEGE CANTEEN






ALUMNI ASSOCIATION


INTERNET & WI-FI


SPORTS & CULTURAL FACILITIES


NSS/NCC/EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES




